Subject: Iceberg in Greenland

On 7 July, an 11-million ton iceberg began to drift towards the western coast of Greenland. It has now come to rest near the settlement of Innaarsuit, which is in considerable peril and is being closely monitored by the Joint Arctic Command and the Copernicus Emergency Management Service. Pieces of ice have already broken off, causing waves to move towards the village, and there is a considerable risk that any larger dislodgements could cause a tsunami.

Does the Commission intend to activate an emergency plan, should this come to pass?
