Subject: Combating anti-Semitism in Europe

Anti-Semitism, a never-ending scourge in Europe, demands a determined, focused response from our institutions. France, like several other European countries, has repeatedly been plagued by anti-Semitic acts, sometimes extending to violence.

A comprehensive survey on anti-Semitism in the EU is to be published this year under the direction of the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA). As far as France is concerned, a national plan to combat racism and anti-Semitism, covering the period from 2018 to 2020, was unveiled in March 2018.

Previously, on 1 June 2017, the European Parliament had adopted a resolution on combating anti-Semitism, in which it urged the EU institutions and the Member States to focus on alternative narratives, education, and the eradication of hate speech online.

Now that more than a year has passed since this resolution was approved, can the Commission give evidence of tangible results brought about by the implementation of measures and initiatives to combat anti-Semitism in Europe?
