## Question for written answer P-007640/2014 to the Commission Rule 130 Beatriz Becerra Basterrechea (ALDE) and Maite Pagazaurtundúa Ruiz (ALDE)

Subject: Spanish plan for dealing with cross-border health threats such as Ebola

Yesterday the first case of Ebola contracted outside Africa was confirmed. The person concerned is a nursing assistant who had been part of a team treating two Ebola patients whom the Spanish Government had decided to repatriate from Africa for treatment in Madrid, where they both later died.

Under Decision No 1082/2013/EU Member States must provide, by 7 November 2014 at the latest, an update on the latest situation with regard to their preparedness and response planning at national level on serious cross-border threats to health.

- 1. Has the Commission received such an update from the Spanish Government?
- 2. If so, what is the Commission's assessment of Spain's national preparedness plan?
- 3. Does the Commission think that the Health Security Committee ought to deliver an opinion before repatriation where there is a serious cross-border threat to health?
