Subject: Impact of decarbonisation on Europe's energy security

Contrary to initial assumptions reported by the Polish Government, the Energy Union has declared decarbonisation of the economy to be one of its pillars.

This formulation is harsher than current climate policy, which is based on reducing emissions and building a low-carbon economy.

Deep decarbonisation implies major transitional costs for the Polish economy and problems with the security of energy deliveries in Poland.

Has the Commission calculated the costs of such a policy for individual Member States, including those in central Europe?

Does the Commission have data on the costs and consequences in terms of security of supply and energy poverty for Poland?
