Question for written answer P-010666/2015 to the Commission Rule 130 Werner Langen (PPE)

Subject: Nürburgring insolvency proceedings

Following the insolvency of the company which operated the Nürburgring in Rhineland-Palatinate, the *Land* government in power at the time assured the contractors and service providers that their financial claims would have priority. They have still not been paid, however. The current *Land* government now claims that it would be in breach of EU law on State aid if it were to designate the contractors as the main creditors. For that reason, and as confirmed by judgments handed down by the European Court of Justice, it maintains that the EU is responsible for determining the order of seniority of the creditors.

In the light of the above:

- 1. Is the Commission aware of the statement made by the Rhineland-Palatinate *Land* government?
- 2. Is it true that EU law on State aid will provide the basis for determining the order of seniority of the creditors?
- 3. What are the implications for the contractors and service providers who are still owed up to EUR 20 million?
