Subject: Compensatory payments for the construction of wind turbines

Under the German Nature Conservation Act, companies constructing wind farms in Germany must pay compensation. Notwithstanding these provisions, however, many companies in Rhineland-Palatinate have been given a significant discount on such compensatory payments in recent years. Some companies have had to pay only 10% of the amount due, while others have had to pay the full amount. The Rhineland-Palatinate Audit Office estimates that EUR 25 million in revenue has been lost as a result, and has suggested that EU state aid legislation may have been breached.

- 1. Is the Commission already aware of this situation?
- 2. Will it launch a state aid investigation into this matter?
- 3. If so, could the possible consequences include the withdrawal of operating permits, as well as retrospective payments?
