Subject: Teacher training requirements in Member States

Work experience, i.e. the actual and lawful pursuit of a profession, is an officially recognised form of training (Burbaud judgment of the CJEU and Decision No 1719/2006/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council). Given that educational work carried out on the ground on behalf of the Italian Ministry of Education, Universities and Research is equivalent to teacher training, work experience of this kind should be taken into account in Italy when determining whether people qualify to be teachers. However, Italy's teacher training requirements are still out of step with those of other Member States.

In order to ensure that transnational rules on teacher training are applied consistently across Member States, will the Commission establish a common system which will make it possible for all EU citizens to find out about teacher training requirements?
