Intentional violation of Food Law - for profit








Food fraud in time

Some examples - food and feed



Adulterated oil Spain 20 000 intoxicated 600 casualties

2000 Adulterated butter • Italy 16 000 Tonnes


2007 Melamine in petfood • China / USA


2006 Melamine in milk • China

300 000 intoxicated 6 reported casualties

2012 Horsemeat scandal

> 50 000 Tonnes of meat declared unfit for human consumption







SEPARATE FLOWCHART SUPPLY CHAIN D

SUPPLY CHAIN D






SEPARATE FLOWCHART SUPPLY CHAIN A

What we learned (1)

Food Sector:

- Some powerful groups with substantial profit margins
- Extensive outsourcing & diversity of supply
- ullet Industrial investments ullet; commercial and advertising actions ullet

Worldwide supply of commodities in hands of "Traders":

Global economic crisis creates new risks

What we learned (2)

- Fraud in the meat sector requires well structured organised logistics (Cold chain)
- Legislation is in place for effective EU-wide traceability of meat
- Positive Member State response
 - Full success of the Coordinated Control Plan (DNA Test + Bute Test)
 - Excellent cooperation of Sanitary/Fraud Authorities
- Adapt official control approach to complex trade pattern
 - Fraudulent practice at top of chain extensive consequences

Coordinated Control Plan results

DNA testing by Member States:

- 4144 tests
- 193 non-compliant (4,66%)


DNA testing by Food Business Operators:

- 7999 tests
- 111 non-compliant (1,39%)

Phenylbutazone testing by Member States

- 3133 tests
- 16 non-compliant (0,51%)

What will the Commission do

Commissioner Borg's Action Plan

1. Prioritise the fight against food fraud

- a. Increase awareness of food fraud by all actors
 - Training
 - BTSF (Better Training for Safer Food)
 - Conferences
- b. Better networking of Competent Authorities
- c. Improve the capability of identifying food fraud (antifraud skills)

2. Food Fraud Team

- a. Improve coordination in food fraud related matters
 - With Member States
 - With other actors (Europol, Olaf, HOME, JUST)
- b. Manage a food fraud IT Tool (RASFF-like)
- c. Prevention of food fraud (information gathering/sharing)

More efficient Official Controls

- a. Unannounced fraud controls in Multiannual Control Plan
- b. Better cooperation in cross-border cases between Member States
- c. Sanctions ≥ financial benefits
- d. Mandatory coordinated control plans
- e. Intensification of official controls at borders in case of suspicion

4. Horse Passport

a. Reduce the number of issuing bodies

b. Require central national database

5. Origin labelling

a. Fresh meat

b. Meat as ingredient
