Title: Privacy & Surveillance: Speaking Out for Human Rights in a Connected World

The Summary: The internet and social media has provided human rights' activists with effective ways to communicate and campaign across borders resulting in greater global awareness of human rights abuses. But a growing fear of terrorism can also close down society. Central to this limitation is a mistrust of state surveillance which increasingly cites the risk of terrorism as a rationale for intruding on our private lives. How can we remain active human rights campaigners living under watchful eyes?

My speech:

Growing terrorist threats in the world have justified mass surveillance of the public and individual life. Prevention measures implemented by different states reflect control and monitoring of Internet communication, landline or mobile telephone as well as tracking of individual's locations or illegal detentions.

Mass surveillance pose a significant challenge to the legality and human rights. The public opinion expresses its concerns about lack of governmental transparency associated with surveillance policies, laws and practices.

Moreover, numerous governments and international bodies sometimes pay most of the attention to the 'hard' measures of preventing and responding to terrorism activities and they ignore essential human rights.

In fact, surveillance activities may take place only in accordance with domestic and international law such as International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights or European Charter of Fundamental Rights.

It should be also pointed out that the Global Network for Rights and Development (GNRD) has launched a global initiative, aimed at creating an independent, transparent and legitimate international mechanism based on an internationally agreed Convention.

I hope that our workshop, speeches, presentations and discussions will lead to relevant conclusions and recommendations that will deal with ideas and goals of the Conference and the GNRD's Convention and will lead to successful measures and policies regarding appropriate balances between human rights, mass surveillance and counter-terrorism.
