DRAFT PROGRAMME

This joint seminar is an excellent opportunity for both members of the **European Parliament** and of the **NATO Parliamentary Assembly** to establish contacts and discuss the issue of the Protection of Critical Infrastructures, whilst benefiting from presentations by the German Presidency, Mr Gijs de Vries, EU Counter-terrorism Coordinator, the European Commission and the Council of the EU.

With regards to **the NATO Parliamentary Assembly**, Lord Jopling, Special Rapporteur of the Committee on the Civil Dimension of Security, will prepare a report this year on "The Protection of Critical Infrastructures". This report will look at what critical infrastructures are, which threats they face, and what role NATO and the European Union can play for their protection. This report follows up on the Committee's work for the past few years on the protection of civilian populations against terrorism and natural disasters. In 2006, the Committee adopted a report on 'NATO and Civil Protection' and in 2005 a report on 'Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear Detection'. These reports aim to inform national parliamentarians of recent developments regarding the protection of civilian populations in the EU/NATO area.

With regards to the **European Parliament**, the LIBE committee will prepare an opinion in 2007 for the Council on the very recent "Proposal for a Directive of the Council on the identification and designation of European critical infrastructure and the assessment of the need to improve their protection" (COM(2006) 787, 2006/0276 (CNS)). Our committee has already dealt with this matter, the most recent report being the one entitled "Fight against terrorism: protection of the critical infrastructures" 2005/2044(INI) - rapporteur Mr. Lambrinidis.
