2. Amendment 14 Paragraph 6

6. Reiterates the importance of, and calls for the maximisation of the use of, the European Investment Bank's i2i objectives; encourages the Commission and the Member States to explore further ways of providing financial assistance for the start-up and growth of small and medium-sized enterprises in the cultural and creative sectors (for example by means of seventh framework programme for research, technological development and demonstration activities); encourages the use of the Structural Funds to support traditional art and heritage sectors, cultural and innovative industries; calls on the Commission to monitor these activities and help the dissemination of best practices.
