Pekka Sutela was born in 1951. He holds a doctorate in economics from the University of Helsinki. He worked there as a tenured lecturer from 1973 to 1991, and returned as Professor in the Economics in Transition in 1995-1997. He joined the Bank of Finland in 1991, and held different positions in research and management, including as Head of the Bank of Finland Institute for Economies in Transition (BOFIT) and Principal Adviser at the Department of Monetary Policy and Research. He retired from the Bank in 2011.

Sutela has been visiting researcher in Britain and Germany. His previous affiliations also include the German Institute for Economic Research (Berlin) and the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace (Washington D.C.). His is currently Visiting Distinguished Professor at Sciences Po (Paris) and Adjunct Professor at the Aalto University School of Business (Helsinki). He has also recently taught at Universities of Jyväskylä and Oulu.

Sutela has published widely and is a frequent media commentator and policy adviser. His most recent English-language monograph, The Political Economy of Putin's Russia (Routledge, 2012) has been assessed in Eurasian Economics and Geography (Anders Åslund) and International Affairs (Philip Hanson) the best book on the topic. He also published Ruplan maa (Siltala) in 2012. Trading with the Soviet Union: Finnish experience in 1944-1991 has been submitted to publisher and is expected to come out in 2013.
