The European Parliament should obtain sufficient data and analysis on whether any workers who received alternative training with the help of the EGF also managed to get permanent employment, as the EP should not be contributing to short-term contracts without long-term employment prospects.

#### Justification

The European Parliament as one arm of the budgetary authority should watch over the use and sound implementation of all existing funding possibilities for member states. This need is particularly highlighted by the fact that althouogh the EGF can only provide one-off support, it is extensively used for funding needs that could be covered by more permanent solutions through other sources. This indicates that the EGF is used as a "quick-fix" solution instead of the more cumbersome procedures of the structural and cohesion funds, as well as education programmes like Life-long learning and others..
