

Proposals Received & Funds Disbursed

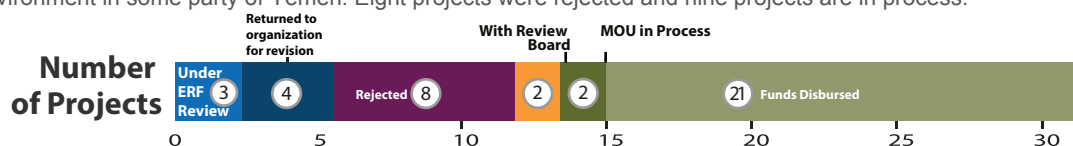
Since the beginning of 2012, ERF in Yemen has received 40 project proposals (two of them in August) for a total amount of US\$ 11,149,716 this is a significant increase in number of humanitarian agencies seeking ERF funding and this has put more pressure on the existing limited ERF money in Yemen. The projects received included:

- 22 proposals from International NGOs
- 8 proposals from National NGOs
- 10 proposals from UN
- 4 proposals from Health Cluster
- 4 proposals from Protection cluster
- 9 proposals from WASH cluster
- 2 proposal from Nutrition cluster
- 2 proposals from Early Recovery cluster
- 1 Capacity Building • 1 Security and Safety • 1 Logistic

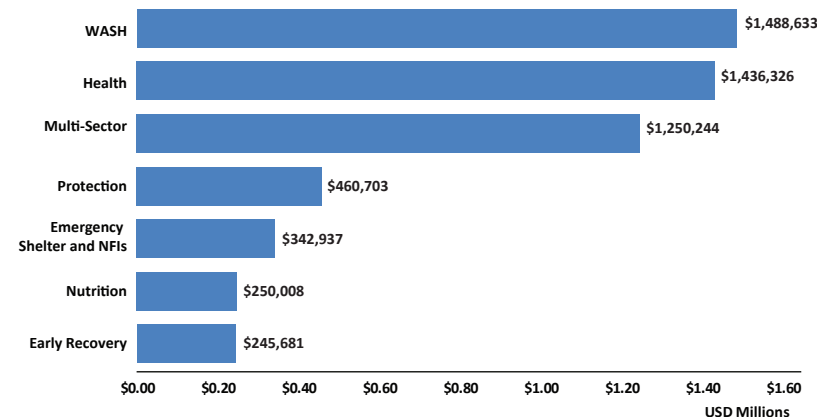
The Projects received per sector are as below:-

- 14 proposals for Multi- Projects
- 2 proposals for Shelter and NFIs cluster

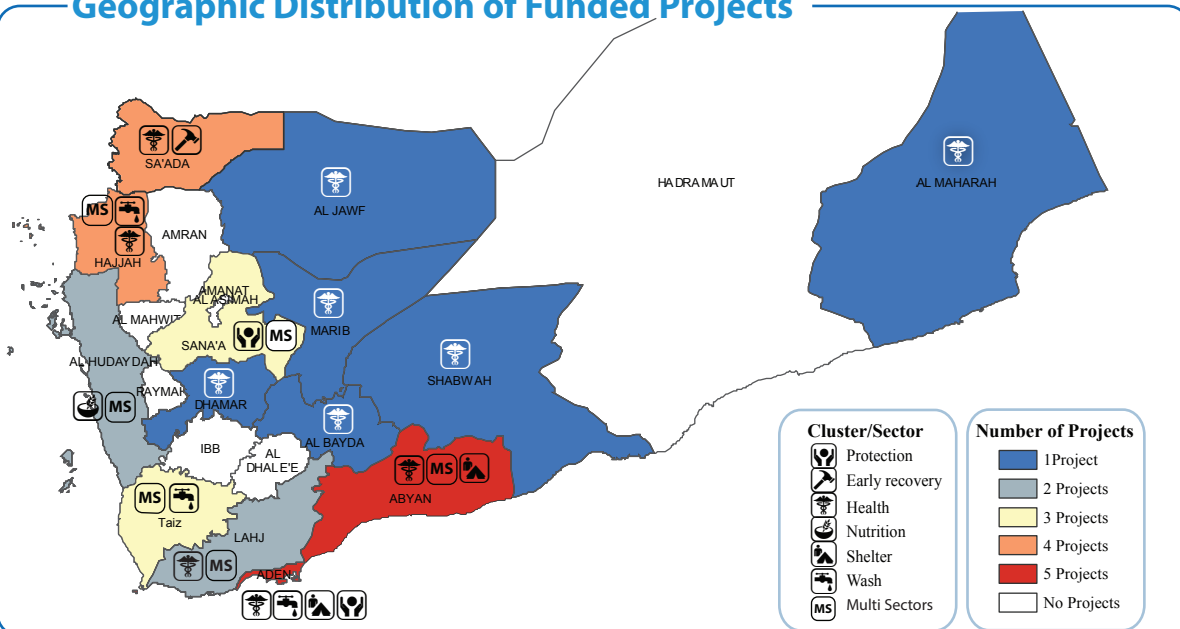
From these projects twenty three projects were approved to address needs Emergency Protection, Health, Shelter, Wash, Early Recovery, Nutrition and Agriculture for total amount US\$ 5,474,532. The summaries below illustrates the allocation made by ERF, indicating that majority of funding went to NGOs who met the ERF funding criteria including their ability to better monitor the project implementation in the current difficult humanitarian access environment in some party of Yemen. Eight projects were rejected and nine projects are in process.



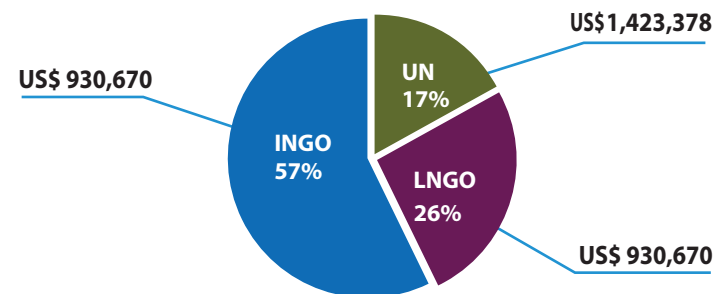
Funds Approved Per Cluster
