The Bethlehem Development Initiative (BDI) aims to transform Bethlehem into a vibrant international spiritual destination. It seeks to create a sustainable economy and infrastructure for Bethlehem that improves the quality of life for residents and acts as an attraction to all types of visitors.

Building on the key religious and cultural assets in Bethlehem, and its strong resulting tourism base, the BDI seeks to identify how the Bethlehem region can:

- Enhance its position as an international religious and spiritual centre;
- Create an attractive urban environment;
