

MR. ADY NIV

Ady Niv is an attorney at the Department of Special International Affairs at Israel's Ministry of Justice.

He holds a Bachelor's Degree in English Law and French Law from Leicester University (UK) and Robert-Schuman University (France), as well as a Masters' Degree in International Law from the Hebrew University in Jerusalem.

Ady Niv served at the Military Advocate General's Corps, first as a Legal Officer at the International Law Department, and subsequently as a Military Prosecutor and Deputy to the Head of Judea Prosecution.

As a military prosecutor he prosecuted high-profile cases in the Military Court of Judea and in the Military Court of Appeals. Such cases included the Ramallah Lynching in October 2000, where two Israeli soldiers were lynched by a mob; the affair of the double suicide bombing in Be'er Sheva in August 2004, when two suicide bombers exploded in two civilian buses, causing the death of 16 and the injuries of dozens; and the murder of Ofir Rahum in 2001, a 16 years old Israeli who was seduced by a Palestinian woman and then murdered by two of her friends.

Ady Niv is a member of Israel Bar Association since 2005, and co-founder of ALMA, the Association for the Promotion of International Humanitarian Law.
