Thank you very much for your letter received today regarding my petition against the French Authorities.

For your information at the time that I made my petition, I also wrote to Mr Bruno Le Maire, Minister of State for European Affairs, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Quai d'Orsay, Paris, France and as a result the French Consulate in London changed their website information and advised me by letter later that my wife was entitled to travel to France without the requirement of a Visa.

On the 14 June my wife and I travelled to Nice, in South of France and we had no problem entering and exited France.

The SOLVIT office was also advised at the time of my petition but by the time they got in touch with me the problem was resolved.

Please thank on my behalf the Committee on Petitions for their letter, which clearly states that my wife does not need to have a visa to visit another European country, which of course I can use, any time I have to travel in another EU country which doesn't implement the Directive 2004/38/EU Article 5(2).
