

**Dr. Suliman Baldo** is a widely recognized expert on conflict resolution, emergency relief, development and human rights in Africa and on international advocacy related to these issues. He has worked extensively in the Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Eritrea and Sudan and travelled throughout the rest of the African continent.

In the 1980s and early 1990s, he worked as a lecturer at the University of Khartoum and as a field director for Oxfam America, covering Sudan and the Horn of Africa. Later, he was the founder and director of Al-Fanar Center for Development Services in Khartoum, Sudan.

He also spent seven years at Human Rights Watch as a senior researcher in the organization's Africa division. Most recently, he worked as a senior analyst before becoming the director of the Africa program at the International Crisis Group and at the International Center for Transitional Justice.

Dr. Baldo holds a Ph.D. in comparative literature (1982) and a master's degree in modern literature (1976), both from the University of Dijon in France. He also holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Khartoum in Sudan.
