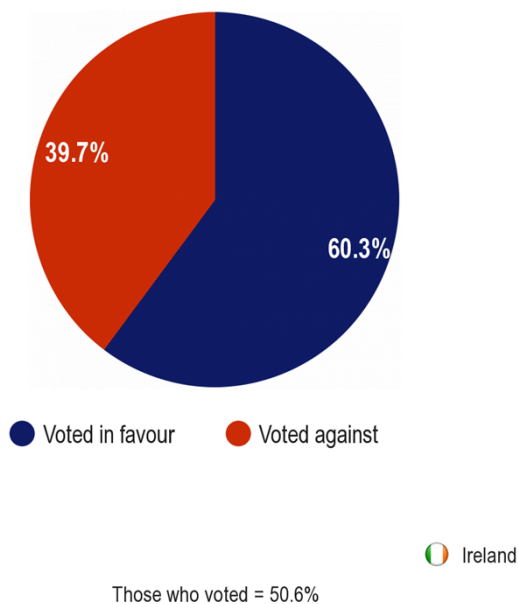

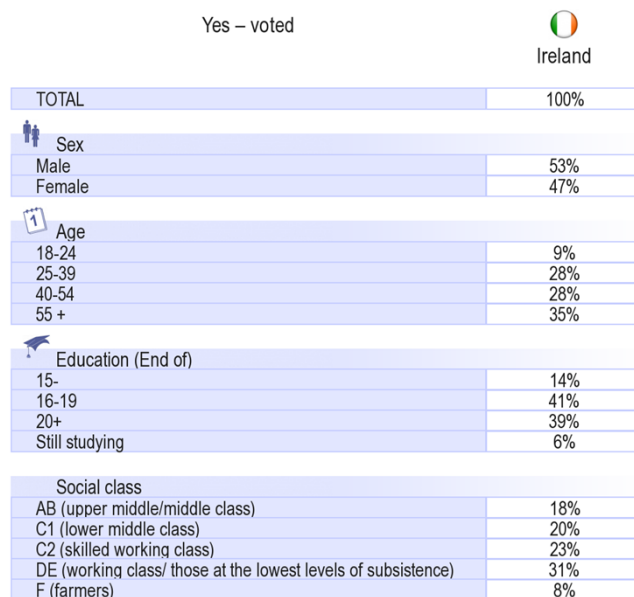

Q2. How did you vote in that referendum – in favour or against the Stability Treaty?

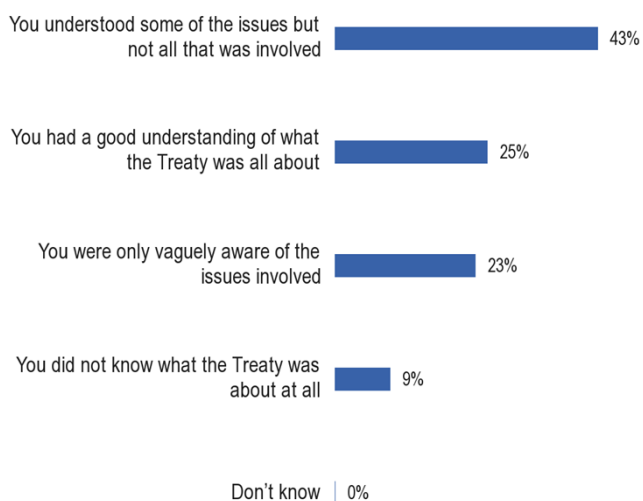

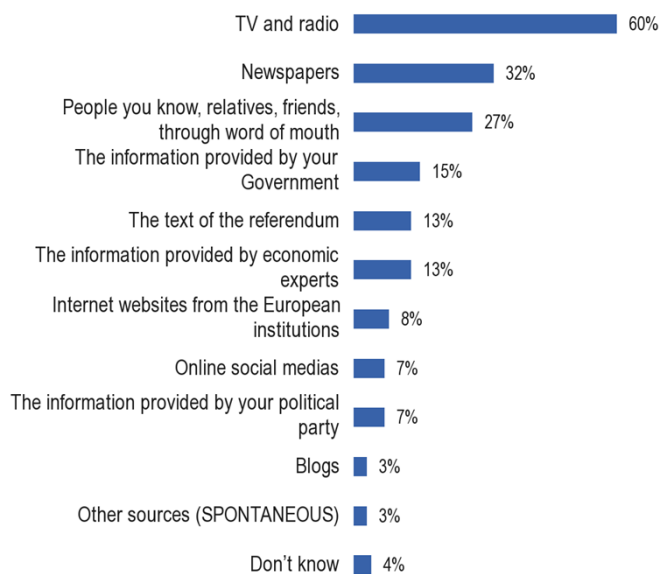

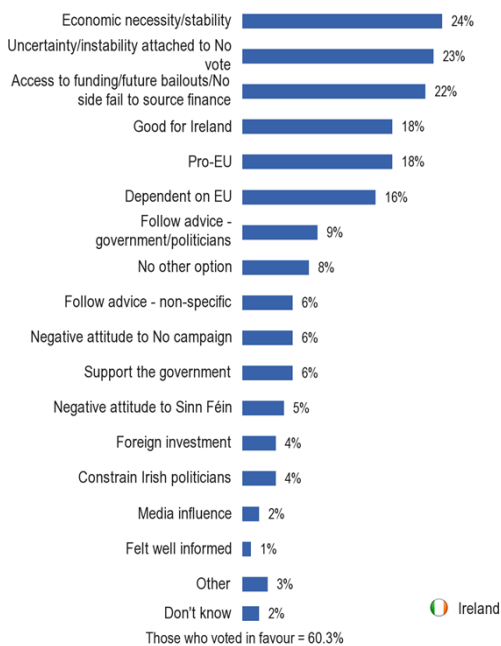

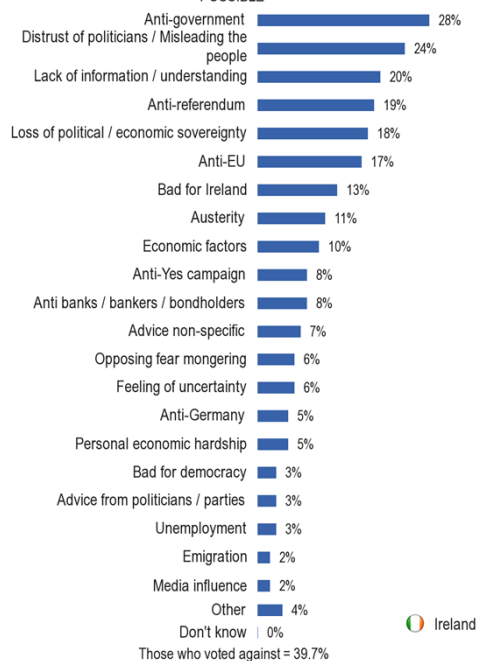

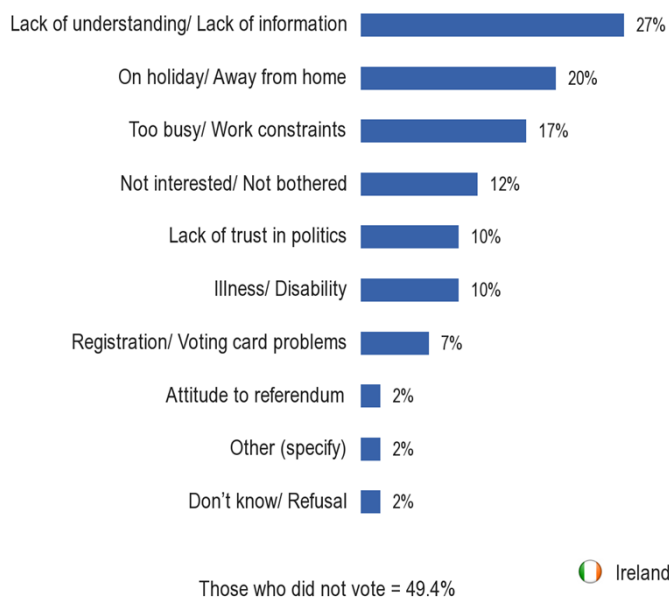
