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### **Troisième rapport sur la mise en œuvre de la stratégie de simplification de l'environnement réglementaire**

#### **1. INTRODUCTION**

Au cours des cinquante dernières années, l'Union européenne a élaboré un ensemble considérable de textes législatifs (l'*acquis*) afin de répondre aux besoins des citoyens, des entreprises et des pouvoirs publics. Elle a donné de nouveaux droits aux citoyens, a ouvert des marchés aux entreprises, a fait avancer l'intérêt général et a contribué ainsi à augmenter la croissance et la prospérité. Cependant, la législation peut aussi avoir un coût. Le défi consiste à trouver un juste équilibre, notamment dans la durée et dans des circonstances changeantes.

C'est la raison pour laquelle, au début de son mandat, cette Commission s'est fermement engagée à revoir l'*acquis* afin de vérifier la pertinence, l'efficacité et la proportionnalité de la législation existante<sup>1</sup>. En conjonction avec le programme parallèle de réduction des charges administratives, la stratégie de simplification de l'environnement réglementaire<sup>2</sup> a défini un programme ambitieux de mise à jour, de modernisation et de simplification du cadre réglementaire de l'UE. Quatre ans plus tard, elle peut se prévaloir de résultats probants. Initialement composée de mesures éparses, l'action de simplification s'est développée jusqu'à faire partie intégrante de toute révision des politiques en vigueur et ce, dans tous les domaines. L'examen analytique de l'*acquis*, dont les résultats sont publiés avec le présent rapport, illustre clairement cette évolution.

Ce troisième rapport sur la mise en œuvre de la stratégie de simplification de l'environnement réglementaire complète le troisième examen stratégique du programme «Mieux légiférer» dans l'Union européenne<sup>3</sup> et le document de travail de la Commission sur la réduction des charges administratives. Il fait le point sur les nombreux domaines couverts depuis le lancement de la stratégie, attire l'attention sur les grandes réussites et recense les domaines devant faire l'objet de mesures de simplification dans le futur.

#### **2. ÉTAT DES LIEUX**

Grâce à une vaste panoplie de mécanismes de consultation, la Commission recueille et analyse en permanence les suggestions des citoyens, des parties intéressées et des États membres en vue de rendre la législation communautaire plus claire, plus simple et plus efficace.

Sur la base de ces contributions, la Commission a mis au point un «programme glissant de simplification» qui a débuté avec 100 initiatives de simplification pour la période 2005-2008. Ce programme utilise l'ensemble des instruments identifiés dans la stratégie de simplification,

parmi lesquels figurent des techniques législatives, comme l'abrogation, la codification et la refonte, mais aussi d'autres moyens permettant de moderniser l'acquis, notamment le recours accru aux solutions informatiques.

Depuis 2007, le programme de simplification est intégré dans le programme législatif et de travail de la Commission. Il a été étendu chaque année à de nouvelles initiatives et couvre à présent tous les domaines d'action. Il se compose actuellement de 185 initiatives dont quelque 132 ont d'ores et déjà été adoptées par la Commission, le taux de réalisation ayant atteint 80 % tant en 2007 qu'en 2008. Cela témoigne de la détermination de la Commission à surmonter tous les obstacles et à produire des résultats en temps utile dans le cadre de cet exercice prioritaire. Plus de la moitié des initiatives adoptées ont maintenant achevé le cycle législatif et ont acquis force de loi suite à leur publication au Journal officiel.

La Commission a déjà proposé près de 800 actes juridiques pour modification ou abrogation dans le cadre du programme de simplification pour 2005-2009. Leur adoption aura pour effet de réduire l'acquis d'environ 600 actes législatifs représentant quelque 6 500 pages du Journal officiel. Mais la simplification va plus loin. Elle constitue désormais un élément inhérent à toute révision des politiques. Parallèlement, la Commission a également continué à codifier l'acquis afin de le rendre plus compact et lisible, tout en garantissant la sécurité juridique. À ce jour, 229 actes ont été codifiés, dont 142 ont déjà été adoptés par le législateur, remplaçant ainsi 729 actes antérieurs, soit environ 1 300 pages de Journal officiel.

Au total, cette Commission a pris des mesures, depuis octobre 2005, qui réduiront l'acquis de presque 10 %, soit environ 1 300 actes législatifs et 7 800 pages de Journal officiel.

### 3. RESULTATS

À ce jour, 75 des 132 initiatives de simplification susmentionnées ont achevé le processus législatif, dont 36 sous la forme d'actes autonomes de la Commission (annexe 4) et 39 sous la forme d'actes adoptés par le législateur (annexe 5).

Les avantages de ces mesures et d'autres initiatives de simplification sont de plus en plus tangibles pour les entreprises, les citoyens et les pouvoirs publics. Les paragraphes qui suivent présentent un certain nombre d'exemples illustrant diverses approches complémentaires de la simplification.

#### 3.1. Un cadre réglementaire plus rationnel

La législation prend forme au fil du temps, au fur et à mesure que de nouveaux éléments sont ajoutés aux actes de base. Afin de garantir qu'ils s'articulent harmonieusement les uns avec les autres et forment un cadre cohérent, la Commission procède en permanence au réexamen de la législation en vigueur, à la recherche de solutions législatives à la fois plus efficaces et moins coûteuses.

- Le nouveau **règlement général d'exemption par catégorie** autorise les États membres à approuver une série de mesures d'aide sans notification préalable à la Commission, ce qui permet un traitement plus rapide des dossiers. Ce règlement, qui vise à promouvoir la création d'emplois et la compétitivité, couvre les aides en faveur des PME, de la recherche, de l'innovation, du développement régional, de la formation, de l'emploi et du capital-risque. Les entreprises peuvent, par exemple, bénéficier d'aides pour la recherche fondamentale (jusqu'à 100 % des coûts), pour la recherche industrielle (jusqu'à 50/70 %)

et pour le développement expérimental (25/45 %). Le règlement constitue également une harmonisation et une consolidation, en un seul texte, de cinq actes législatifs.

- Les nouvelles règles concernant les contrôles des **paiements directs aux agriculteurs** offrent un cadre plus simple et plus efficace pour la sélection de l'échantillon de contrôle, pour le calendrier des contrôles et les procédures de vérification sur place<sup>4</sup>.
- Le nouveau règlement relatif aux **statistiques structurelles sur les entreprises** réduit le nombre d'informations exigées et instaure des collectes annuelles de données au lieu de collectes effectuées plusieurs fois par an. Simultanément, une nouvelle classification statistique des activités économiques dans la Communauté européenne a été introduite. Ces dispositions devraient conduire à une diminution nette de 17,5 % des données à déclarer.
- La législation cadre dans les domaines couverts par les stratégies thématiques sur **la pollution atmosphérique et sur la prévention et le recyclage des déchets** a été rationalisée, clarifiée et simplifiée. La nouvelle directive sur la qualité de l'air ambiant résulte de la fusion de cinq directives distinctes, et la nouvelle **directive-cadre relative aux déchets** reprend les dispositions des directives, auparavant distinctes, sur les déchets dangereux et les huiles usagées.
- La nouvelle **directive-cadre sur l'eau** offre un cadre politique cohérent et unique pour la planification, l'exécution et la notification dans un but de protection et de rétablissement de la propreté de l'eau en Europe, et réduit de 18 à 10 le nombre de directives applicables au secteur de l'eau.
- Une nouvelle directive sur **la santé et la sécurité au travail** simplifie et rationalise les rapports à fournir par les États membres concernant la mise en œuvre pratique de la directive-cadre et des directives spécifiques. Dorénavant, les États membres ne seront plus tenus de présenter un rapport tous les cinq ans.

### **3.2. Amélioration des méthodes de travail et simplification des procédures**

La Commission encourage activement l'utilisation plus large de l'informatique en tant que moyen d'améliorer les procédures de travail.

- Le nouveau **vocabulaire commun pour les marchés publics** (description communautaire type des produits) facilite l'identification des marchés publics proposés partout dans l'UE, quelle que soit la langue du pays où l'appel d'offres est lancé. Les formulaires utilisés par les pouvoirs publics pour la publication des avis au Journal officiel de l'UE ont été normalisés et informatisés, ce qui a réduit le délai de publication de douze à cinq jours. Ces deux améliorations augmenteront la transparence en matière de passation des marchés publics. Chaque jour, des opportunités de marchés dans le secteur public, représentant plus d'un milliard d'euros, paraissent sur le site web de l'UE qui présente le bulletin quotidien des appels d'offres: *Tenders Electronic Daily* (TED).
- La simplification du **Code des douanes communautaire** vise à moderniser la législation douanière de l'UE ainsi qu'à créer un environnement sans support papier pour les autorités douanières et les opérateurs. L'enregistrement électronique des déclarations en douane et des documents d'accompagnement deviendra la règle. Les opérateurs agréés pourront

déclarer leurs marchandises par voie électronique et acquitter les droits de douane dans l'État membre où ils sont établis, quel que soit le lieu d'entrée des marchandises sur le territoire douanier de l'UE ou leur lieu de sortie de ce territoire, ou encore leur lieu de consommation. Une fois que ce système intégré sera totalement opérationnel, il devrait entraîner des économies de l'ordre de 2,5 milliards d'euros par an pour les opérateurs.

- La modification de l'article 55 du **règlement général concernant la politique de cohésion** a simplifié les règles applicables aux petits projets générateurs de recettes. La disposition concernant la proportionnalité du suivi des petites opérations (dont le coût total est inférieur à 200 000 euros) est remplacée par une exemption de l'application de l'article en question dans le cas d'opérations cofinancées par le Fonds social européen et le Fonds européen de développement régional ou le Fonds de cohésion dont le coût total est inférieur à 1 million d'euros.

### 3.3. Un marché intérieur qui fonctionne bien

Le marché intérieur a été et reste un moteur pour la simplification dans l'UE, permettant de fondre une multitude de lois nationales en un acte législatif unique.

- Les **règles communes pour l'exploitation de services aériens** dans la Communauté constituent une révision de ce qu'il est convenu d'appeler le «troisième paquet» de libéralisation du transport aérien. Elles devraient contribuer à élargir le choix pour les consommateurs, à faire baisser les tarifs et à accroître la concurrence. Des exigences plus strictes et une meilleure supervision des nouvelles compagnies aériennes réduiront également le risque de faillite et ses conséquences négatives pour les passagers. Le coût moyen annuel que représentent les faillites pour ces derniers, y compris les frais de rapatriement et les pertes sur les réservations anticipées, est estimé à 15,6 millions d'euros. Une diminution de 50 % du nombre de faillites parmi les transporteurs aériens comptant jusqu'à deux ans d'activité permettrait aux consommateurs d'économiser 2,4 millions d'euros en moyenne par an.
- La directive révisée relative à **l'interopérabilité du système ferroviaire** au sein de la Communauté modernise les règles qui s'appliquent à la certification des véhicules. Les économies pouvant être réalisées par les entreprises ferroviaires et les fabricants de matériel ferroviaire sur les coûts de certification sont estimées à 200-280 millions d'euros sur les quinze prochaines années.
- Le nouveau règlement concernant les **limites maximales applicables aux résidus** (LMR) de pesticides présents dans les denrées alimentaires et les aliments pour animaux remplace près de 500 000 LMR nationales par 100 000 LMR communautaires et dispense dorénavant les opérateurs de soumettre des demandes multiples dans différents États membres.
- Le **«paquet TVA»** introduit de nouvelles règles applicables aux services, en vertu desquelles les services d'entreprise à entreprise seront désormais imposés dans l'État membre du client. Cette disposition devrait inciter les entreprises à proposer leurs services dans toute la Communauté. Ce paquet prévoit également un mini guichet unique pour les services de télécommunications, de radiodiffusion et de télévision, et de commerce électronique à l'intention des entreprises établies dans l'UE, ainsi qu'une nouvelle procédure de demande de remboursement de la TVA pour les entreprises qui ne sont pas établies dans l'État membre où la TVA a été acquittée.

- Dans le domaine du **droit des sociétés**, la directive adoptée en procédure accélérée en 2007 sur les fusions et les scissions rationalise les fusions transfrontalières, permettant ainsi aux sociétés anonymes d'économiser 17 millions d'euros.

#### **4. AUTRES RESULTATS ATTENDUS: PROPOSITIONS EN INSTANCE ET ASPECTS INTERINSTITUTIONNELS**

Le nombre de mesures de simplification adoptées par le Conseil et le Parlement européen a progressé, passant de 16 en janvier 2008 à 39 en janvier 2009. Néanmoins, 50 propositions de simplification sont toujours en attente au Conseil et au Parlement européen (annexe 3). Il est important que ces institutions avancent dans l'examen de ces propositions, afin que les entreprises, les citoyens et les administrations publiques bénéficient d'avantages encore plus nombreux.

- La nouvelle directive européenne concernant les fonds d'investissement, connus sous l'appellation d'«**OPCVM**» (organismes de placements collectifs en valeurs mobilières), offrira aux consommateurs la possibilité d'accéder, à un coût raisonnable, à des placements gérés par des professionnels; elle permettra aux gestionnaires d'OPCVM de développer leurs activités transfrontalières et de réaliser des économies d'échelle tout en consolidant l'épargne, donnera aux investisseurs la possibilité de bénéficier d'un plus grand choix de fonds d'investissement avec des frais de gestion moindres et protègera les petits investisseurs en veillant à ce qu'ils reçoivent des informations claires, facilement compréhensibles et pertinentes lorsqu'ils investissent dans des OPCVM. Cette directive remplacera dix directives existantes par un seul texte.
- Plusieurs propositions importantes ont été élaborées dans le domaine du **droit des sociétés** en vue de simplifier l'exercice des activités dans l'UE et de réaliser des économies significatives. Parmi ces mesures figurent la proposition de règlement du Conseil relatif au statut de la société privée européenne, la proposition visant à réduire les obligations de traduction et de publication pour les sociétés (qui représenterait une économie estimée à 600 millions d'euros) ainsi que la proposition concernant les obligations en matière de rapports et de documentation en cas de **fusions ou de scissions**.
- Le nouveau **règlement sur les cosmétiques** remplacera plus de 3 500 pages de législation. Tout en maintenant le niveau élevé des normes de sécurité, la proposition réduit d'au moins 50 % les coûts supportés par les entreprises. Les procédures d'évaluation de la sécurité des produits sont clarifiées et les règles de notification pour les nouveaux produits cosmétiques sont simplifiées. L'impact en sera considérable, étant donné que le marché européen des cosmétiques représente environ 65 milliards d'euros et génère, directement et indirectement, plus de 350 000 emplois.
- Dans le domaine des médicaments, la révision des **règlements «Modifications»** assurera l'harmonisation des critères d'évaluation des modifications et des délais en matière d'examen et d'autorisation. Les données disponibles indiquent qu'une entreprise typique de médicaments génériques doit gérer, chaque année, plus de 1 500 modifications concernant des médicaments, tandis qu'une grande entreprise pharmaceutique doit en traiter plus de 12 000. La proposition renforcera la compétitivité des entreprises en réduisant les problèmes logistiques liés, par exemple, à la nécessité de stocker plusieurs versions d'un même produit pour différents marchés nationaux. Le cadre simplifié aidera les entreprises, en particulier les PME, à étendre leurs activités à d'autres marchés de l'UE.

- La nouvelle proposition de «**paquet relatif à la sécurité automobile**» simplifiera l'environnement réglementaire actuel en abrogeant 150 directives concernant la réception des véhicules et introduira l'obligation d'équiper les voitures particulières de dispositifs de sécurité et de systèmes de contrôle de la pression des pneus, ce qui devrait considérablement améliorer la sécurité des véhicules et réduire les émissions de CO<sub>2</sub>.
- La directive relative aux **droits des consommateurs** contribuera à un meilleur fonctionnement du marché intérieur entre professionnels et consommateurs en diminuant la réticence des entreprises vis-à-vis des échanges transfrontaliers. Elle réduira la fragmentation et simplifiera le cadre réglementaire existant en abrogeant quatre directives. La directive améliorera le cadre réglementaire, et l'institution d'un ensemble de clauses types pour les contrats de consommation permettra une réduction sensible des coûts de mise en conformité.
- L'ensemble de propositions en matière **d'efficacité énergétique** vise à réaliser des économies d'énergie dans des domaines essentiels, notamment en renforçant la législation relative à l'efficacité énergétique applicable aux bâtiments et aux produits consommateurs d'énergie. Les économies d'énergie annuelles peuvent facilement dépasser 1 000 euros en moyenne par ménage.
- Dans le domaine des **statistiques sur les échanges intracommunautaires de biens (Intrastat)**, les seuils de déclaration fixés par la législation européenne auront pour résultat d'exempter près de 370 000 entreprises de l'obligation de déclaration. Cela représente une diminution d'approximativement 52 % de la population observée sur six ans (de 720 000 en 2004 à 350 000 en 2010).
- La proposition concernant **la mise sur le marché et l'utilisation des aliments pour animaux** renforcera l'innovation et la compétitivité des entreprises de ce secteur. Le nouveau règlement entraînera l'abrogation de sept directives, faisant passer le nombre de pages de 100 à environ 30. La procédure dissuasive d'autorisation préalable à la mise sur le marché pour certains produits (bioprotéines) sera également supprimée, car elle est disproportionnée par rapport au risque encouru. Pour donner une idée de l'enjeu en termes de réduction des coûts, l'obtention d'une autorisation pour une nouvelle bioprotéine représente pour l'industrie un coût total estimé à 481 000 euros.
- La proposition de refonte de la directive relative à la **prévention et à la réduction intégrées de la pollution (IPPC)** vise à fusionner sept directives concernant les émissions industrielles en un seul instrument législatif. Elle supprimera les parties obsolètes des directives existantes, simplifiera les exigences relatives aux permis d'émission, réduira les déclarations auxquelles sont tenus les exploitants et rationalisera les exigences en matière de rapports à fournir par les États membres. Cette proposition conduira à une baisse considérable des coûts administratifs, estimée à 32 millions d'euros par an, et permettra en outre une réduction encore plus significative – de l'ordre de 150 à 300 millions d'euros par an – de la charge administrative dans les États membres (aux niveaux national et régional)
- Le **train de mesures «GSM»** vise à ouvrir les bandes de fréquences des 900 et des 1 800 MHz (fréquences GSM) à des utilisations plus innovantes. Il supprimera les dispositions restrictives qui ne sont plus en phase avec l'évolution technologique et qui font obstacle à une large utilisation des services mobiles à large bande.
- Le «bilan de santé» de la politique agricole commune conduira à une simplification du **régime de paiement unique**. Il entraîne, en particulier, l'abandon des deux systèmes

parallèles d'aide couplée et d'aide découpée et le passage à un découplage accru. Rien qu'au Royaume-Uni, le découplage devrait assurer une réduction de 0,63 million d'euros de la charge administrative des exploitants. La simplification entraîne aussi la suppression de l'exigence du gel de 10 % des terres. Les exploitants peuvent utiliser toutes leurs terres et ne sont plus obligés de se soumettre aux procédures associées, tandis que les États membres ne sont plus tenus de contrôler l'application en la matière. À titre d'exemple, les avantages attendus de cette simplification, rien qu'en Angleterre, sont une réduction des coûts administratifs de 4,4 millions d'euros pour les exploitants<sup>5</sup>.

- Toutes les dispositions relatives au contrôle des **activités de pêche** seront rassemblées dans un même cadre réglementaire mettant en particulier l'accent sur l'utilisation accrue des technologies modernes et sur les liens avec des bases de données.
- La réforme du **paquet «télécommunications»** conduira à une réduction nette des coûts administratifs des entreprises du secteur en diminuant le nombre de marchés susceptibles d'être soumis à une réglementation ex ante, en simplifiant les procédures d'examen des marchés, en mettant en place un organisme européen de régulation et en réformant la gestion du spectre. Les services et les infrastructures de communications électroniques forment la trame qui sous-tend l'ensemble de l'économie, de sorte que les améliorations apportées dans ce secteur profiteront au reste de l'économie de l'UE.
- La proposition pour l'amélioration de la mise en œuvre des **programmes de la politique régionale** vise à faciliter la gestion financière et à accélérer la mise à disposition des ressources financières communautaires nécessaires pour les projets et les programmes opérationnels. En particulier, la Commission a proposé que les frais généraux des projets soient remboursés sur une base forfaitaire et que les avances versées aux bénéficiaires sous la forme d'aides d'État puissent être remboursées en intégralité aux autorités publiques par l'UE. Ces modifications seront particulièrement utiles aux PME.
- La modernisation de la coordination des **régimes nationaux de sécurité sociale** facilitera la libre circulation des travailleurs et des membres de leur famille au sein de l'UE. Elle bénéficiera également aux 173 millions de titulaires de la carte européenne d'assurance maladie, qui peuvent avoir accès aux soins de santé dans l'État membre où ils séjournent temporairement dans les mêmes conditions que les ressortissants de cet État.

Le nombre de propositions en instance devant le Conseil et le Parlement européen est en augmentation. Par conséquent, il est primordial d'examiner les moyens d'accélérer leur adoption et de tout mettre en œuvre pour parvenir à un accord, si possible, en première lecture dans le cadre de la procédure de codécision. La Commission se félicite de l'intention du Parlement européen d'établir des structures spécifiques pour encourager la simplification, ainsi qu'il ressort du rapport de M. Medina Ortega, adopté récemment.

Le Parlement européen a confirmé son souhait de voir la Commission adopter la refonte comme technique législative ordinaire, même lorsque la «révision» des textes en vigueur est proposée. Cependant, il est important que le Conseil et le Parlement européen s'alignent sur les principes et l'esprit de l'exercice de simplification en veillant à ce que les propositions adoptées restent aussi simples que possible et en accélérant le processus décisionnel, afin que les entreprises, les citoyens et les pouvoirs publics puissent bénéficier des nouvelles dispositions.

## 5. CODIFICATION

La Commission ne se contente pas de simplifier la législation, mais elle la codifie également en réunissant l'acte de base et ses modifications successives en un texte unique. Cette opération a pour résultat de rendre les actes législatifs plus clairs et de réduire le volume de l'acquis communautaire.

À ce jour, la Commission a finalisé au total 229 actes de codification, dont 142 ont été adoptés et publiés au Journal officiel (102 actes de la Commission et 40 actes du Parlement européen et du Conseil). Ces 142 actes codifiés remplacent 729 actes antérieurs correspondant à environ 1 300 pages de Journal officiel.

87 actes sont toujours à l'examen auprès du Conseil et du Parlement européen.

L'arriéré de traduction vers les nouvelles langues de la législation destinée à être codifiée a été en grande partie résorbé. Le reliquat des propositions prévues dans le programme de codification, qui a été revu en 2006, sera présenté en 2009 et sera accompagné d'un rapport détaillant les résultats du programme dans son ensemble. 21 nouveaux textes législatifs ont été sélectionnés en vue de leur codification en 2009 (annexe 6).

## 6. LES PROCHAINES ETAPES

### 6.1. Initiatives en préparation pour 2009

La Commission a intégré 33 initiatives de simplification dans son programme législatif et de travail pour 2009<sup>6</sup> (annexe 7).

Exemples:

- la révision de la directive 2000/35/CE concernant la **lutte contre le retard de paiement dans les transactions commerciales**, qui découragera les pouvoirs publics et les entreprises de retarder les paiements à leurs fournisseurs et incitera les créanciers à demander une indemnisation en cas de retard de paiement. Cette initiative fait partie du «Small Business Act for Europe» et du «Plan européen de relance économique»;
- la simplification de la législation communautaire sur les **tracteurs agricoles et forestiers** par la substitution d'un règlement unique aux 24 directives actuelles;
- la modification et la modernisation du règlement (CE) n° 44/2001 afin de l'adapter aux nouveaux instruments internationaux et de garantir la **reconnaissance et l'exécution des décisions en matière civile et commerciale**, par la suppression des étapes intermédiaires que les citoyens doivent franchir (exequatur) pour qu'une décision judiciaire soit reconnue et exécutée à l'étranger;
- la réforme de l'**organisation commune des marchés dans le secteur des produits de la pêche et de l'aquaculture**, en mettant l'accent sur les activités de pêche et de commercialisation durables. Elle comprend l'adaptation à l'évolution des marchés, le renforcement de la cohérence avec d'autres éléments de la politique commune de la pêche

ainsi qu'avec des politiques communautaires apparentées (commerce, santé et protection des consommateurs, environnement) et encouragera l'utilisation accrue des moyens électroniques.

Par ailleurs, la Commission poursuit ses travaux avec les États membres en vue de rechercher d'autres possibilités de simplifier la réglementation applicable à la politique de cohésion et de réduire les charges administratives pour les bénéficiaires.

## **6.2. Examen analytique de l'acquis et futures activités de simplification**

Comme elle l'avait annoncé dans le deuxième examen stratégique du programme «Mieux légiférer» dans l'Union européenne, la Commission a réalisé un examen analytique exhaustif de l'acquis.

Tout d'abord, elle a procédé à un examen systématique de l'acquis en vue d'identifier les instruments réglementaires les plus importants. Cet examen a débouché sur la sélection d'environ 3 600 actes. Ceux-ci ont fait l'objet d'un examen plus détaillé destiné à déterminer s'ils étaient à jour ou s'il y avait matière à simplification.

La série complète des résultats par domaine d'action sera publiée sur le site web consacré à la simplification<sup>7</sup> du portail Europa afin de donner un aperçu clair des efforts accomplis à ce jour par la Commission en matière de simplification.

Les résultats de l'examen font apparaître dans quelle mesure:

- des actions de simplification ont déjà été réalisées;
- des actions de simplification sont prévues en 2009;
- il y a matière à simplification durant le mandat de la prochaine Commission;
- des mesures de simplification ne sont pas prévues, dans le cas de textes clairs, à jour et proportionnés aux objectifs poursuivis. Dans certains cas, des modifications de la législation pourraient offrir des avantages, mais ceux-ci seraient neutralisés par les coûts et les charges que devraient supporter les entreprises et les administrations publiques, notamment pour la transposition.

L'impression qui se dégage est celle d'une avancée considérable. Environ deux tiers des actes, concernant principalement l'agriculture, le marché intérieur, les transports, les entreprises, la santé et l'environnement, ont été simplifiés dans le cadre du programme glissant de simplification, du programme de codification ou d'autres initiatives de la Commission, ou ont été inclus dans les propositions de simplification prévues pour 2009 (annexe 2).

Cet état des lieux prépare également le terrain pour d'autres activités de simplification. En examinant les actes en vigueur dans leur contexte sectoriel, la Commission s'achemine vers une approche intégrée de la simplification. 81 actions supplémentaires (annexe 1) pourraient être incluses dans de futures initiatives de simplification.

- l'alignement de quinze directives d'harmonisation technique sur la décision établissant un **cadre commun pour la commercialisation des produits**. Cette décision définit des formules types concernant des éléments couramment utilisés dans la législation d'harmonisation technique, qui devraient être introduites dans la législation future. L'objectif est d'assurer une plus grande cohérence de l'environnement juridique et de créer une «culture» législative commune. Cela améliorera la qualité de notre législation et réduira les charges administratives;
- la simplification des règles de mise en œuvre de la **politique agricole commune** à la suite de l'adoption du «bilan de santé», en ce qui concerne le mécanisme de gestion des interventions;
- la révision de la législation relative aux **menaces pour la santé** (maladies transmissibles et menaces chimiques, biologiques et radionucléaires), ainsi qu'à la **santé et au bien-être des animaux et aux aliments pour animaux**;
- une nouvelle réduction des charges dans le domaine des **statistiques** grâce au programme de modernisation des statistiques européennes sur les entreprises et sur le commerce «**MEETS**» (*Modernisation of European Enterprise and Trade Statistics*). Ce programme améliorera les méthodes de collecte des données dans les États membres par un recours plus important aux données administratives et comptables et de meilleurs plans d'échantillonnage, ainsi que par une utilisation améliorée et plus intensive des sources disponibles.

## 7. CONCLUSIONS

Depuis le lancement, en 2005, de la stratégie de simplification de l'environnement réglementaire, la simplification occupe une place importante dans les travaux de la Commission. À travers une série d'activités coordonnées, la Commission a établi un cadre d'action politique et pratique procurant des avantages tangibles aux citoyens, aux entreprises et aux administrations publiques. Dans le but de rendre la législation plus claire et compréhensible, la Commission a proposé de supprimer quelque 1 300 actes, représentant environ 10 % de l'acquis, du corpus de la législation communautaire.

La simplification est un processus continu. L'aperçu obtenu par l'examen analytique de l'acquis prépare le terrain pour les travaux futurs. Le programme en la matière, qui a démarré avec un nombre limité d'initiatives éparses, couvre à présent tous les domaines d'action et sa mise en œuvre s'effectue de plus en plus selon une approche sectorielle. Celle-ci implique d'examiner l'ensemble de la législation qui concerne un domaine donné afin d'identifier les doubles emplois, les lacunes, les incohérences et les charges réglementaires excessives. L'objectif est d'évaluer l'efficacité globale du cadre réglementaire, secteur par secteur.

Pour faire avancer le programme de simplification, la Commission aura besoin du soutien politique des autres institutions de l'UE ainsi que des États membres. Le Parlement européen et le Conseil sont invités à tout mettre en œuvre pour adopter les propositions en instance dans les meilleurs délais et pour préserver leurs dispositions de simplification au cours du processus décisionnel. Les États membres sont encouragés à poursuivre leurs propres programmes de simplification et à appliquer la législation communautaire dans un esprit de simplification, sans y ajouter des mesures inutiles.

Tous les jours, les citoyens et les entreprises en Europe sont confrontés à une combinaison de dispositions législatives communautaires, nationales et régionales. Seul un effort coordonné de simplification à tous ces niveaux peut faire en sorte que ce cadre réglementaire remplisse son objectif de la meilleure manière possible, à savoir préserver la croissance et la prospérité tout en réduisant les charges au minimum nécessaire.


