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BACKGROUND ♦♦♦

Seminar for journalists

On and around International Women's Day, the European Parliament press service is organising a seminar for journalists titled "Women's economic empowerment: let's act together". The aim of this networking event is to generate a debate between key media actors and leading MEPs and invited experts.

Initiatives by the European Parliament

The Pension Gap

Ahead of the vote in plenary, this report calls for a comprehensive, far-reaching strategy to address the gender pension gap. Most pension entitlement systems are based on lifelong earnings. Hence, pay inequalities and the traditional distribution of family roles limit women's ability to make pension contributions. Statistical tools such as wage mapping can determine how the gap is formed and help gaining better understanding of the issue. These findings could lead to a more targeted policy framework.

Work-Life balance

In a recent own-initiative report, the European Parliament has urged the Commission to propose legislation on a comprehensive work-life balance package. An effective work-life balance promotes economic growth, competitiveness, overall labour market participation, reduction of the risk of poverty, and intergenerational solidarity. It addresses the challenges of an aging society and positively influences birth rates in the EU.

Women's economic empowerment

An upcoming report by the European Parliament will propose actions and tools for improving the economic empowerment of women, by creating conditions conducive to a greater participation of women in the economy: tackling the gender pay gap, introducing quotas, reducing gendered division of care and family responsibilities thereby improving work-life balance, and introducing wage mapping.

Raising awareness

In 2016, Nadia Murad and Lamya Haji Bashar, who survived sexual enslavement by the so-called Islamic State and are now raising awareness for women afflicted by the terrorist group's violence, received the European Parliament's Sakharov Prize for Freedom of Thought. The two Yazidi women are advocates for their community and for women surviving sexual enslavement by the self-proclaimed Islamic State.

In 2014, Dr Denis Mukwege, gynaecologist and founder of Panzi hospital in Bukavu/Democratic Republic of the Congo, received the Sakharov Prize for standing up for women's rights and helping victims of sexual violence in a conflict where rape is used as a weapon of war.

In 2013, the European Parliament awarded its Sakharov Prize for Freedom of Thought to Malala Yousafzai, who later received the Nobel Peace Prize, in acknowledgement of her brave fight for access to education for all children.
