Written declaration, under Rule 136 of Parliament's Rules of Procedure, on the differences in declarations, composition and taste of products in eastern and western markets of the  $\mathrm{EU}^1$ 

- 1. Some studies have confirmed differences in declarations, composition and taste of products in eastern and western markets of the EU.
- 2. It has been demonstrated that many products sold in 'eastern' markets are of much lower quality and contain far fewer high-quality ingredients than those sold in the western market. This problem affects a wide spectrum of products from food and toiletries to detergents and disinfectants which are of inferior quality to 'identical' products in the western segment of the EU market.
- 3. We are engaged in negotiations with the USA on TTIP; meanwhile, our own market is still far from uniform.
- 4. Given that the EU has a single market, the Commission is called upon to monitor the situation, take steps to bring order to the single market and reduce discrimination against consumers in the eastern Member States.
- 5. This declaration, together with the names of the signatories, is forwarded to the Council and the Commission.
