Language training should be provided by the Member States to beneficiaries of international protection in order to facilitate integration. Member States should also be encouraged to develop training programmes about the fundamental laws and core values of the Member State of residence and the principles of democracy, human rights and equality, as well as individual rights and obligations in that Member State.

Justification

This proposal intends to give a long-term resident status to beneficiaries of international protection who have been residing legally on the territory of the EU for more than 5 years. This gives them a real opportunity to integrate, which means, being able to communicate in at least one of the official languages of their Member State of residence and to increase their awareness of their rights and obligations as well as the core values of the Member State of residence.

Where the family was constituted in another Member State, the Member State mentioned in the remark shall admit the family members of the long-term resident according to the applicable Union or national legislative provisions.**”

Text proposed by the Commission

1. Member States shall bring into force the laws, regulations and administrative provisions necessary to comply with this Directive by at the latest. They shall forthwith communicate to the Commission the text of those provisions and a correlation table between those provisions and this Directive.

Amendment

1. Member States shall bring into force the laws, regulations and administrative provisions necessary to comply with this Directive by **2 years** at the latest ***after its entry into force***. They shall forthwith communicate to the Commission the text of those provisions and a correlation table between those provisions and this Directive.

Justification

The legal text should provide for a period of 2 years maximum for the transposition of provisions into Member States' national legislation.
