## Written declaration on the need to establish more and fairer trade relations with Africa

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Doha Development Agenda and the current WTO negotiations,
- having regard to the report 'Our Common Interest' by the Commission for Africa,
- having regard to the Commission Communication on the contribution of the European Union to speeding up progress towards the Millennium Development Goals, with a special focus on Africa (COM(2005) 132),
- having regard to Rule 116 of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. whereas Africa faces enormous challenges in achieving the Millennium Development Goals,
- B. whereas Africa's share of world trade is still less than 3%,
- C. whereas establishing more and fairer trade relations with Africa is vital to ensure sustainable growth and poverty reduction,
- 1. Welcomes the Commission's renewed commitment to Africa's development;
- 2. Urges the Commission to turn this commitment into concrete action by abolishing all trade distorting agricultural export subsidies, in order to allow Africa to better develop its full trade potential;
- 3. Stresses the need to promote African regional free trade agreements and to invest more in technical assistance to enhance Africa's capacity to trade in a diverse range of products and services;
- 4. Instructs its President to forward this declaration, together with the names of the signatories, to the Council and the Commission.
