The potential impact of the unitary Supplementary Protection Certificate on access to health technologies



Dear Reader,

In the EU, medicinal products can be temporarily protected from direct competition by multiple forms of market protection. One of these is the Supplementary Protection Certificate (SPC), which effectively grants holders an extension of the patent protection by a maximum of 5 years.

Following the introduction of the Unitary Patent (UP) and the Unified Patent Court (UPC) through the Agreement on the Unified Patent Court (AUPC),

in April 2023 the Commission published a set of SPC proposals.

The study for JURI: "The potential impact of the unitary Supplementary Protection Certificate on access to health technologies" offers an overview of the SPC proposals for medicinal products, provides insight into their potential impacts on access to medicine, and aims to assist MEPs in their assessment of the proposed Regulations.

The EU Emissions Trading System

This in-depth-analysis appraises the system used for the free allocation of emission allowances within the EU ETS, reviews its transparency and assesses related risks. The authors estimate the cost of free allocation to the EU budget and how the proceeds might be spent. In conclusion they recommend three policy approaches.



The role of cyber in the Russian war against Ukraine

Russia's ongoing war against Ukraine raises concerns about the harm inflicted on the civilian population – and about the protection of civilians and civilian infrastructure – from both kinetic and cyber attacks. This report for SEDE analyses the magnitude of the war's cyber dimension, its impact, and the lessons learned. The authors aim to increase understanding about the threat environment and to strengthen cyber resilience and defence capabilities across the EU and in neighbouring countries.



Performance of the Package Travel Directive

Policy Department for Economic, Scientific and Quality of Life Policies



Owing to fast-paced changes in the industry, including digitalisation and a complex landscape of online intermediaries, the Package Travel Directive (PTD) requires updating. The study requested by IMCO committee identifies areas for improvement: adapting the definition of package travel, addressing pre-contractual information gaps, improving payment practices, tackling digitalisation challenges, enhancing enforcement, promoting alternative dispute resolution, and increasing consumer awareness.



Chinese Investments in European Maritime Infrastructure

Policy Department on Structural and Cohesion Policies



The study looks at Chinese investments in European Maritime Infrastructure through the lens of 'de risking' for the first time. It provides a comprehensive overview of Chinese investments in this sector over the past two decades and weighs the associated risks that arise from the deliberate strategy by China to leverage its investments in European maritime infrastructure to its own advantage, and as a result of conflict scenarios.
