Transparency of EU funding for NGOs



Dear Reader,

NGOs receive support from the EU Budget, and the CONT Committee monitors the transparency of such funding. A new study looks into NGO financing within the EU. The quality of grant funding data and electronic systems has improved, but it remains difficult to have clarity about the use

of funding and other financial support NGOs receive.

The study advocates for a joint effort and makes recommendations to Parliament, Commission and NGOs themselves, e.g. a more specific definition of NGOs and subcategories, enhanced NGO transparency, an interoperable electronic reporting and monitoring system of the Commission that clarifies final recipients and monitors implementation. The study is very useful, as it recognises the important role NGOs play in our society, but also shows where improvements and more clarity are needed.

The effect of due diligence EU legislation on SMEs

Policy Department for External Relations



This study for INTA addresses the impact of EU due diligence legislation on SMEs. It offers an overview of the existing legislation and its impact as well as an analysis of practical implications and key challenges for SMEs. It also discusses support measures that SMEs need or are already using. The research is based on interviews with business associations, chambers of commerce and supporting agencies This publication include policy recommendations.



Analysis of the European Disability Card

Policy Department for Economic, Scientific and Quality of Life Policies



The proposed directive on a European Disability Card (and European Parking Card) would facilitate free movement for people with disabilities by ensuring that cardholders can avail of disability benefits in a range of services across the EU. The study requested by EMPL committee describes the proposal as a milestone in the development of EU disability law but also identifies a number of shortcomings. The study makes recommendations as to how these can be addressed during the legislative phase.



Development of milk production in EU after the end of milk quotas

Policy Department on Structural and Cohesion Policies



The study evaluates the challenges, opportunities and medium term prospects for the EU dairy sector in light of milk quota abolition. It focuses on structural change in the sector, the dynamics of the dairy market, the need for environmental resilience and rural sustainability. The specific concerns of disadvantaged dairy regions are also addressed. The report also offers policy recommendations for the European Parliament's consideration.



Homelessness in the European Union

Policy Department for Citizens' Rights and Constitutional Affairs



This study, requested by the PETI Committee, stresses the need to change systems responding to homelessness as an issue of individual dysfunction and inadequacy, to systems that end homelessness. Public policy should aim to prevent homelessness. For those experiencing homelessness, the duration must be minimised by providing secure, affordable housing, so as to reduce further experiences of homelessness, decrease costly emergency accommodation, and alleviate trauma associated with homelessness.
