

Reasons for a Convention - late 1960'

Absence of guarantees, procedures, monitoring



Many abuses



→ Minimum safeguards for ICA



Some examples of minimum safeguards

Child is adoptable

Free and informed consent

Adoptive candidates eligible and suitable

Placement in **best** interests of the child

Involvement of State of origin and receiving

Preserve information + access to information




Objectives





- Stricter controls and supervision










Some good practices


