



1990-2008




- Unexplained
- Natural hazards (esp. wildfire)
- Expansion of urban areas & infrastructure
- Industrial roundwood production (logging)
- Ruminant livestock production
- Crop production

Deforestation and trade (1990-2008)

- Substantial part of the embodied deforestation remains in the country or (world) region of production: crops (two thirds), livestock (92%) and wood products (two thirds)
- EU27 imported 36% of all deforestation embodied in crop and livestock products traded internationally (equivalent to 9Mha of deforested land).
- The second ranked region was Eastern Asia (includes China and Japan), with 4.5 Mha. North America imported 1.9 Mha.




- Now ongoing: a feasibility study on a possible AP on deforestation, implemented by a consortium of consultancy firms
- Three deliverables, available end of 2016:
 - ✓ 1) a mapping of existing EU policy, legislation and initiative that can address, directly or indirectly, the drivers of deforestation and forest degradation within and outside EU borders.
 - ✓ 2) to identify and assess the policy options that can address the drivers of deforestation and forest degradation at global scale.
 - √ 3) Stakeholders online survey

Several initiatives on palm oil



- The Dutch Presidency in December 2015 organised a conference on 'EU Global Supply Chains', where the **Amsterdam Declaration** on sustainable palm oil (supported by NL, DK, DE, FR and SE) was presented.
- In December 2015 the Commission (DG ENV) organised a technical workshop on 'Palm oil environmental sustainability standards' with the participation of experts and NGOs from Europe, Indonesia and Malaysia.
- The Commission (DG ENV) is considering a **study** on the environmental impact of palm oil consumption and on existing sustainability standards.
- The EU's Emergency Response Coordination Centre (ERCC) is supporting Indonesia's National Disaster Management Agency (BNPB) in addressing forest and peat fires.
- The EU Delegation to ASEAN will shortly launch the Sustainable Use of Peatlands and Haze Mitigation in ASEAN (SUPA) Project, worth about €25m (€4m from Germany).
