Introductory words by Thomas Händel



The first committee meeting of the month will take place on 15 and 16 June. An exchange of views will be held with Maroš Šefčovič, Vice President of the European Commission, focused on the consequences for employment triggered by the energy transition and its impact on unemployment. The committee meeting will count as well with the consideration and adoption of

the question for oral answer on minimum income. There will be the consideration of amendments on the draft report on How best to harness the job creation potential of small and medium sized enterprises (SMEs). Commissioner Günther Oettinger will exchange views with EMPL Members on the impact of the Commission's Digital Agenda on the EMPL Committee's field of responsibilities, in particular with regard to employment, wages and skills. Co-Rapporteurs will present their EMPL-FEMM draft report on Creating Labour Market Conditions Favourable for Work-Life Balance. There will be a presentation of the Opinion of the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights on requirements under Article 33 (2) of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities within the EU context, and a presentation by the Commission on the establishment of the Structural Reform Support Programme for the period 2017 to 2020.

The meeting agenda for 21 June will start with a joint hearing of EMPL and ECON on reasons, repercussions and remedies of economic inequality in the EU. An exchange of views will be held with Jyrki Katainen, Vice President of the Commission, as part of the structured dialogue. This meeting will include the consideration of amendments of the draft report on Guidelines for the employment policies of the Member States. Finally, the meeting will include the votes of the oral question on Youth Guarantee and Youth Employment Initiative, and the draft reports on Protocol to the EC/ Switzerland Agreement on the free movement of persons, to take account of the accession of the Republic of Croatia to the EU, the draft report on Employment Equality Directive and the draft report on activities, impact and added of EGF 2007-2014.

At the plenary, Commissioner Thyssen presented the New Skills Agenda for Europe with an exchange of views with the Members.

On 18 March, the European Parliament requested the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA) to deliver an opinion concerning requirements under Article 33 (2) of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) within the EU context. The opinion aimed to feed into the EMPL

implementation report on CRPD and to support the EU's follow up to the 'Concluding observations on the initial report of the European Union' by the UN CRPD Committee, which were published on 2 October 2015.

Establishment of the Structural Reform Support Programme for the period 2017 to 2020 Presentation by the Commission

The Commission will present the legislative proposal on the establishment of the Structural Reform Support Programme. This legislative proposal was adopted by the Commission on 26 November 2015. The Structural Reform Support Programme will have the objective of strengthening the overall capacity of Member States to prepare and implement growth-enhancing institutional, structural and administrative reforms.

News from the Agencies

European Centre for the Development of Vocational Training (Cedefop)

A new tool for policy-makers in the area of learning mobility, the mobility scoreboard for initial vocational education and training was presented by Cedefop in Thessaloniki on 3 June. The tool was developed in close cooperation with the European Commission and focuses on 10 key areas for action. A prototype with information on 26 EU Member States, Iceland and Norway is already available while the finalized tool will be launched during the VET week in December. More.

European Foundation for the Improvement of Living and Working Conditions (Eurofound)

The European Social Services Conference 2016 produced by the European Social Network (ESN) in cooperation with the Dutch Presidency of the EU Council will be held between the 20th and the 22nd of June. This year's edition focuses on the role of local communities and their empowerment. Eurofound will contribute to this conference in particular through the setting up of a workshop. More.

European Training Foundation (ETF)

As the Commission just released the New Skills Agenda for Europe, the ETF publishes a report on Highlights and insights exploring the contribution of the agency in helping transition and developing countries harness their human capital potential. More.

European Agency for Safety and Health at Work (EU-OSHA)

In the next ten years, the impact of ICT, robotics and artificial intelligence will be particularly important for the nature and location of work. A foresight project has been commissioned by EUOSHA in order to produce a set of scenarios on potential changes to work and its implications on workers' safety and health. A summary of key issues is already available as well as a short survey to allow stakeholders to share their views. More.
