In Focus

Delegation to Seville

REGI committee organised a delegation to Seville and the Joint Research Centre to look for practical implementation of the Smart Specialisation Strategies at local and regional level.

The delegation, which took place from 3 to 5 December, was composed of three REGI members (Lambert van Niistelrooij, Chair of delegation, Derek Vaughan and Lilliana Rodrigues) and one accompanying Member elected from Seville, Soledad Cabezon Ruis.

During the visit the Members had a number of meetings with the local and regional authorities and with scientists at the Joint Research Centre. The Members were primarily interested in the ways that the region of Andalusia, Spain's southernmost peripheral region suffering the highest unemployment rate, and its capital city Seville, implement the Smart Specialisation Strategies in order to make the best use of the region's potential and to improve the quality and efficiency of the European funding in the region.

A discussion at the Joint Research Centre - Institute for Prospective Technological Studies, host of the Smart Specialisation Platform, revealed the complex and divergent realities that European territories are facing with regards to Smart Specialisation, which is now an ex-ante conditionality enshrined by the Common Provisions Regulation.

Exchange of views with Commissioner Cretu, Commissioner for Regional Policy

Commissioner Corina Cretu underlined importance of the European Parliament support especially on the CPR amendment for Greece. Mrs Cretu expressed her wish to continue such a good dialogue and cooperation with the REGI Committee members in 2016. She underlined her priorities regarding cohesion policy contribution to the Juncker Plan putting the focus on the job creation and sustainable growth. Commissioner also pointed out importance of the good cooperation with Member States in order to ensure the best results for the beneficiaries of the cohesion policy. Regarding current migration crisis, Mrs Cretu expressed her support for a larger use of the cohesion funds for the support for refugees. So far only 5 Member States answered to this call.

As for 2016 Commissioner expressed her wish to continue work on the simplification of the Cohesion policy, preparation of the next cohesion policy period and MFF mid-term review. Mrs Cretu expressed her wish as for the effective implementation of programmes with a specific focus on their performance.

In all areas of her portfolio, Commissioner Cretu, wishes to continue an open and transparent dialogue with the MEPs.

Workshop on financial instruments in cohesion policy



The experts' presentations at the REGI Workshop provided interesting insights into the use of Financial Instruments in cohesion policy, combining ESI funds with loans, bank guarantees or equity. They highlighted the opportunities and challenges of mixing these financial sources and reported about experiences on the ground and in the context of urban development.

The Commission encouraged regional and national actors to increase the use of Financial Instruments, arguing that they enhance the effectiveness and the impact of Structural funds, have a considerable multiplication potential and help mobilising additional public or private investments in the regions.

In the debate with the REGI Members, all participants agreed on the need for simplification of the complex implementation rules when combining Financial Instruments and ESI Funds and stressed the importance of administrative capacities at the operational and management level.

Exchange of views with Martina DLABAJOVÁ, CONT rapporteur for the discharge 2014

On 14 January 2016, Martina Dlabajová (ALDE), Rapporteur of the European Commission Budget Discharge 2014, will take part in an exchange of views to discuss the draft opinion issued by Ms Maletić (EPP) on behalf of the REGI Committee.

Ms Dlabajová will address important topics raised in the draft opinion such as increasing error rates, weak financial control systems, and overly complex administration. During her exchange of views with Commissioner Cretu on 7 December 2015, Ms Dlabajova stressed the importance of simplified procedures - a view echoed by the Maletić draft opinion. It is hoped that this exchange of views in January will strengthen understanding and cooperation between CONT and REGI, particularly in the field of simplification.

On January 11 two Ministers/State secretaries (one on cohesion policy and one on Urban Agenda) will visit REGI committee in order to present the priorities of the forthcoming Dutch Presidency of the Council.

During its six months presidency, the Netherlands will bring the cohesion agenda forward without starting or closing any important item in cohesion policy. The Presidency will be implementing already agreed priorities (Urban agenda; Smart Specialisation Strategies; Simplification; Synergies), but will also work towards bringing new possible proposals following the MFF and Europe 2020 midterm review. It should be noted that the EU Urban Agenda - a broad conceptual framework that could include a wide range of topics - will be high on the Dutch agenda.

Therefore, the presidency will define the focus of the Agenda for the next months with the key priority of setting up partnerships. The Presidency is also planning to organise a number of workshops, to draft orientation papers and to formulate concrete proposals on how to proceed in a number of areas.

Cohesion policy in mountainous regions of the EU

2015/2279 (INI) Opinion: AGRI



Rapporteur: **Iliana lotova (S&D)**

The draft report of Ms lotova focuses on the development needs the mountainous regions have in the European Union as well as on their potential to become sources of jobs and sustainable growth.

Among other suggestions, the rapporteur calls for a definition of the mountainous regions from the regional policy angle, proposes an Agenda for EU Mountainous Regions which would represent a framework providing additional focus within Cohesion Policy, and pleads for a coordination of EU policies with an effect on these areas.

The draft report will be presented on 14 January, while the deadline for tabling amendments is provisionally set for 26 January. The vote of this report is foreseen for 17 March.

On 14 December, the European Commission adopted the <u>Communication</u> on the Contribution of the European Structural and Investment Funds (ESI Funds) so called "Article 16" report.

REGI Committee has organised an exchange of views with Commissioner Cretu, which will be an opportunity for Members to go into deeper detail on all aspects of the contribution of the <u>European Structural and Investment Funds</u> (ESI Funds) to <u>the Europe 2020 Strategy</u>, the <u>Investment Plan</u> and the Commission's priorities over the next decade.

The report also includes the outcomes of negotiations with all Member States on Partnership Agreements and programmes, and <u>the key challenges per country</u> - one of the key points of interest for REGI Members.
