

Prof. Dr. Michael EMERSON

Michael Emerson is a graduate in politics, philosophy and economics from Balliol College, Oxford University. After some years at the OECD in Paris, he joined the European Commission in 1973, where until 1990 he worked as an economist on macroeconomic affairs, and as economic adviser to the President. In 1991 he was appointed as the EU's first Ambassador to the USSR (subsequently Russia). Returning from Russia in 1996 Emerson joined the London School of Economics as Senior Research Fellow, and from 1998 at the Centre for European Policy Studies (CEPS) in Brussels. Emerson has published extensively on European affairs and external relations. He has worked intensely on the Brexit question over the last two years, alongside a research project on the three new Association Agreements and DCFTAs of the EU with Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine.
