

Prof. Dr. Peter-Tobias STOLL

Dr. Peter-Tobias Stoll is a full professor for public law and international law at the Faculty of Law of the Georg-August-Universität Göttingen, Germany and the managing director of the Institute for International Law and European Law. His research areas include international and Union law and particular the interfaces between economic law, including trade and investment and environmental and consumer protection. Recently, he has focused on EU trade agreements and related constitutional issues.

Tobias Stoll has studied law in Hamburg, Lausanne and Bonn and obtained his doctorate at Kiel University and his habilitation at the Heidelberg Faculty. Before joining the Göttingen Faculty, he has been senior research fellow at the Max Planck Institute for Foreign Public Law

and Public International Law, Heidelberg.

Stoll has published widely on trade and environmental as well as on Union law issues. He is one of the cochairs of the Interest group for international economic law of the European Society for International Law (ESIL) and is a member of the Committee on Sustainable Development and the Green Economy in International Trade Law of the International Law Association (ILA). He served as advisor and expert to the Federal government, the German Bundestag and the United Nations.
