1.2. Update on Brexit [EC]

Coordinators took note of the latest developments including that a comprehensive EP resolution on the future EU/UK relationship was expected to be adopted in the first quarter of 2018. For the the joint LIBE/EMPL/PETI hearing see point 2.3 of the agenda.

1.3. European Parliamentary days - 19 and 20 February 2018 [EC/CF]

The 2018 European Semester Conference (Article 13) will take place on 19-20 February 2018 in Brussels. It will include three plenary sessions as well as an interparliamentary committee meeting organised by EMPL on the **afternoon of 19 February**. An updated draft of the structure, prepared at a technical level , and a questionnaire for each topic to be discussed at the EMPL meeting were among the meeting documents.
