

SUGGESTIONS


The Committee on Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs calls on the Committee on Budgetary Control, as the committee responsible, to incorporate the following suggestions into its motion for a resolution:

- 1. Welcomes the Court of Auditors' ("the Court") conclusions that the annual accounts of the European Monitoring Centre for Drugs and Drug Addiction ("the Centre") present fairly its financial position on 31 December 2016 and that its transactions are legal and regular;
- 2. Welcomes the high budget execution rate of the Centre, with commitment and payment appropriation reaching respectively 99,95 % and 95,64 % and consumption of carry-over credits reaching 94%; notes however that the budget of the Centre decreased by 17% in 2016 compared to 2015;
- 3. Regrets the Court's finding that one of the Centre's employees, appointed as acting Authorising Officer to evaluation committees, took award decisions and signed contracts for two framework contracts despite the fact that this function was not explicitly authorised by the delegation of powers granted by the Authorising Officer; welcomes the commitment of the Centre to adjust the content of its delegation of powers accordingly and to put in place effective control measures to prevent such occurrences;
- 4. Notes with concern that the Internal Audit Service concluded that there is no overarching long-term strategic vision for the IT systems supporting the Centre's core operational processes, that its IT project management methodology was only partially adapted to its needs, and that the process to manage system requirements is inadequate; encourages the commitment of the Centre to develop an action plan to remedy the aforementioned weaknesses:
- 5. Welcomes the development and adoption of the EMCDDA Strategy 2025, which is the first long-term plan of the Centre;
- 6. Recalls that the Courts' conclusions of 2015 highlighted the fact that the Centre did not respect the ceiling of a framework contract which was signed in 2012 with a maximum amount for signing specific contracts of EUR 250 000, and notes that by the end of 2015 the total payments made under this contract amounted to EUR 382 181; underlines that this issue was flagged as "ongoing" by the Court still in 2016; calls on the Centre to improve the procedure for monitoring framework contracts in compliance with such ceilings;
- 7. Encourages the commitment of the Centre to provide improved access to its data to interested third parties, given that one of its main objectives is the dissemination of data and information on the state of the drugs problem, including data on relevant new trends; expects such a commitment to result in effective corresponding actions being taken.
