The Members highly appreciated your presentation and the quality of your answers and your observations to their questions.

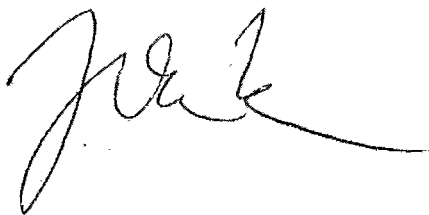
Nonetheless, the committee Members would like to understand better the ABLV Bank case and the general ML/FT situation in Latvia. They have asked me to transmit to you the following requests and questions.

The committee would be grateful if you could share the entire FinCEN's report on ABLV Bank. Additionally, Members would like to know the reasons why the FCMC gave ABLV Bank up to five years to implement the corrective measures it had imposed on the latter and had not opted for a shorter timeframe. In this connection, the committee would like to invite FCMC to share the plan undertaken by ABLV Bank to implement the corrective measures. Finally, the committee would like to know whether FCMC has requested similar corrective measures from other financial institutions in Latvia and, if that is the case, whether you kindly specify how many and the kind of measures imposed on them.

The committee would be grateful if you could send your reply by 4 June 2018.

We look forward to continuing our dialogue with you and with your institution on this important topic.
