Decree of the MAF on indicating the country of origin of certain foods FINLAND

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Decree of the MAF (218/2017) on indicating the country of origin of certain foods 1/2

- meat used as an ingredient in foodstuffs (no threshold)
 - beef, swine, sheep, goat and poultry meet
 - country of origin of a meat used as an ingredient of meat preparation or meat product shall also be indicated
 - "country of rearing (EUMS or 3. country)" and "country of slaughter (EUMS of 3. country)"
- ☐ milk and milk used as an ingredient in dairy products and certain corresponding products (defined in the Annex of the Decree)
 - "country of milking: (EUMS or 3. country)"
- ☐ IF meat or milk has been obtained from several countries or the country of origin varies, it is possible to use indications "EU", "non-EU" or "EU and non-EU"





Decree of the MAF on indicating the country of origin of certain foods 2/2



- ☐ IF the labelling contains the voluntary Hyvää Suomesta (ie. 'Good from Finland') label referring to the country of origin of the food and its ingredients, no further information on the country of origin of meat or milk is required
- □ scope
 - <u>prepacked foods</u> <u>manufactured in Finland</u> and intended for a final consumer or for mass caterers
- ☐ fixed-term pilot project
 - the Decree entered into force on <u>1 June 2017</u> and shall be in force until <u>31 May 2019</u>
 - the MAF shall submit a report on the application of the Decree to the EU Commission by 31 January 2019.





Draft Decree on indicating the country of origin of meat and fish used as an ingredient of meals delivered by mass caterers

- meat: beef, swine, sheep, goat, poultry, horse, reindeer and game meat
 - fresh, chilled and frozen meat, incl. minced meat
 - country of origin (EUMS of 3. country) = country of rearing of the animal
- ☐ fish: wild-caught and farmed fish
 - fresh, chilled and frozen fish, fish fillets and other fish meat
 - <u>fish caught at sea</u>: "catch area (FAO major fishing area/subarea/division)" <u>fish caught in freshwater</u>: "country of origin: (EUMS or 3. country) <u>farmed fish</u>: "country of production: (EUMS or 3. country)
- ☐ A negative opinion from the EU Commission issued 6.2.2018
- □ A modified draft will be notified to the Commission shortly





Motivations and expected impacts of the national measures 1/3

- ☐ The principal justification of the national measures is the consumers' right to have sufficient and correct information about foodstuffs
 - as consumers are the ones making the choices, they need sufficient information to make the decisions
 - most consumers wish for more comprehensive information on the origin of foods than what we offer today
 - consumers have a growing interest in where the food comes from, where and how it has been produced, and through what stages it has ended up on the consumer's plate
- ☐ Consumers are concerned about the purity of food production as well as about animal health and welfare and the conditions where the animals are reared





Motivations and expected impacts of the national measures 2/3

- ☐ TNS Monitor Ruoka ("Food") 2015 study
 - 91% of the consumers wish for <u>clear indications of the country of origin</u> of food.
- ☐ Suomi Syö ("Finland Eats") 2015 study of Taloustutkimus
 - 88% of the consumers consider the <u>origin of meat</u> as **important**
- ☐ KANTAR TNS Study 2018
 - 82% of the consumers consider the <u>country of origin labelling of the</u> <u>meat</u> used as and ingredient <u>and the milk</u> used as an ingredient as <u>important</u> in prepackaged foods (Decree of the MAF 218/2017)







Motivations and expected impacts of the national measures 3/3

- ☐ KANTAR TNS Study, May-June 2018
 - about 80% (meat 78 %, fish 80 %) of the consumers consider information on the country of origin of meat and fish used as an ingredient in the meals delivered by restaurants and other mass caterers as important
 - **76%** of the consumers consider that there is a link between the quality of meat or fish food and its origin
 - 82% of the consumers consider it important that the information on the <u>country of origin is provided in writing</u> in restaurants, so that you don't have to specifically ask about it
