Defining missions and partnerships

- Formulate the process of defining m&p first then move on to proposing specific areas and consequently - concrete topics.
- Need for adequate engagement of stakeholders
 Need for collaboration in the process
 Research community, civil society, Member States...
 They should contribute: When? Where? How?
- Missions should be based on collaborative projects
- Partnerships (especially institutionalized partnerships) added only if clear European added value



Projects

- Grants should remain the main tool for funding research and innovation in all three pillars:
 - 1. Open Science,
 - 2. Global Challenges and Industrial Competitiveness,
 - 3. Open Innovation
- Basic research should be supported by all pillars, not only by the ERC!
- Pillar 2 should be implemented through open calls for collaborative research projects, TRL levels from 1 to 8
- Simplify the procedures!



Sharing excellence / Widening participation

- Excellence already exists in the widening countries!
- Main target:
 existing networks of excellence, which are largely closed
 they must open up to increase participation
- Current widening actions are good,
 Increased budget for widening is good,
 ...but widening participation
 should be treated as a horizontal issue in the Programme while respecting the excellence principle



Sharing excellence / Widening participation (2)

- Setting a concrete target could help reach the objectives (e.g., increase participation from 4% to 10%!)
- Proposed approach:
 Incentives for consortia with 'widening' participants

 Evaluation criteria intact: based on excellence
 Selection criteria to be modified: preferences for widening



Sharing excellence / Widening participation (3)

- Synergies should be further developed and exploited especially those with the Structural Funds which are dedicated to regions
- However, no direct overlap between mechanisms:
 Widening should be based on the indicator used in H2020
 Widening dedicated to countries (not regions)
- Financing projects holding the **Seal of Excellence** should be **based on Horizon Europe rules** including the state aid provisions ...transfers from Structural Funds to Horizon Europe are risky: may cannibalize SoE, evaluation bias...
