3. STUDY ON EU-FUNDED LARGE-SCALE INFRASTRUCTURE: DEFICIENT PROJECT PREPARATION AND PROCUREMENT PROCESSES?

Presentation of the study

Public procurement is a key part of the Europe 2020 strategy for smart, sustainable and inclusive growth. It is one of the market-based instruments to be used to achieve the Europe 2020 objectives by improving the conditions for business to innovate and encouraging the wider use of green procurement supporting the shift towards a resource efficient and low-carbon economy. At the same time, the Europe 2020 strategy stresses that public procurement policy must ensure the most efficient use of public

funds and that procurement markets must be kept open Union-wide.

The study will assess if the major large-scale infrastructure projects are well planned, cost-efficient and provide sustainable results. In order to identify weaknesses of the current public procurement processes, systems and legislation, the study will analyse more in detail the ex-ante evaluation, the organisation of call for tenders and the cost benefit analysis undertaken by the European Commission when selecting the projects. Recommendations will be drawn with the aim of ensuring a more transparent, efficient and accountable public procurement.

The European Court of Auditors reports have indicated that the expenditures in 2017 of the "Other Institutions" were free of material error. No significant weaknesses were detected by the ECA in relation to the topics audited.

The Secretary-Generals of the Other Institutions received the questions put by CONT Members with technical and specific queries on 16 October 2018. The written replies were made available to Members on 15 November 2018 and can be consulted on the <u>CONT website</u>.

6. 2017 DISCHARGE TO THE JOINT UNDERTAKINGS

For the financial year 2017, the eight Joint Undertakings (JUs) subject to the discharge procedure by the Parliament are the following: Innovative Medicines Initiative (IMI),

Electric Components and Systems for European Leadership (ECSEL), Single European Sky ATM Research (SESAR), CLEAN SKY, Fuel Cells and Hydrogen (FCH), Bio-Based Industries (BBI), Fusion for Energy (F4E) and Shift2Rail.

The European Court of Auditors in their reports have indicated that the accounts of all eight JUs present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Joint Undertaking at 31 December 2017 in accordance with their Financial Regulation and with accounting rules adopted by the Commission's accounting officer. However for ECSEL, the Court has added a qualified opinion as to projects taken over by the Artemis and ENIAC JUs due to variation of methodologies and procedures used by the National Funding Authorities (NFAs). For F4E the Court's opinion was accompanied by an emphasis of matter related to the EU contribution to the ITER project costs.

The Court pointed out that two JUs - SESAR and IMI - had implementation rate for payment appropriations significantly lower than expected. The Court pointed out that for BBI there is a high risk that the industry members will not achieve the minimum amount of operational cash contributions (182.5 million euro) by the end of the programme.

From the eight Joint Undertakings, the Rapporteur selected three of them to be invited to the hearing:

- Development of Fusion for Energy (F4E)
- Electric Components and Systems for European Leadership (ECSEL)
- Single European Sky ATM Research (SESAR)

Other JU representatives are also welcome to attend the hearing if they so wish.

It is proposed that the hearing shall proceed as follows:

- Presentation of the Rapporteur;

- The Joint Undertakings will reply to the questions posed;
- Closing remarks of the ECA Member and Rapporteur.

The Commission proposal that forms an integral part of the MFF 2021-2027 package, aims at establishing the rules necessary for the protection of the Union's budget in the case of generalised deficiencies as regards the rule of law in Member States.

CONT and BUDG members will have the opportunity to consider the 242 amendments tabled on 25 October 2018.

In addition to the 48 amendments already presented by the co-rapporteurs during the joint BUDG/CONT meeting of 10 October 2018, the Members tabled 194 amendments regarding in particular fundamental values and Copenhagen criteria, assessment of generalised deficiencies, protection of final beneficiaries and the procedure to adopt/lift measures needed in case of deficiency concerning the rule of law. Some amendments aim at rejecting the Commission proposal.
