- To better protect, safeguard, reuse, enhance, valorise and promote Europe's cultural heritage.






# Eurobarometer on cultural heritage

Public authorities should allocate more **resources** to Europe's CH (74%).

















## **EYCH - Mainstreaming**



# Cherishing heritage

- **European Parliament** (2015) asks the Commission to "include in the guidelines governing the next generation of structural funds for cultural heritage a compulsory <u>quality control system</u>, to apply throughout a project's life-cycle".
- Statement of the Latvian Presidency Conference, "Heritage, Contemporary Architecture and Design in Interaction" (Rīga, 2015) "ensure that decisions on any major changes in the historical environment are based on ethical principles, balanced cultural and historical analysis, justified policies for sustainable development and responsible long-term spatial visions, basing any change to cultural heritage on proper assessment of its values, including technical approaches and materials"
- **EYCH 2018** 'promote debate, research and the exchange of good practices on the quality of conservation, safeguarding, innovative re-use and enhancement of cultural heritage, and on contemporary interventions in the historical environment'. Art. 3 specific objective 2©
- Council of the EU (2018) invites the Commission, "when planning, implementing
  and evaluating EU policies, to continue to take into consideration their direct and
  indirect impact on the enhancement, conservation and safeguarding of Europe's
  cultural heritage and in particular the need for quality guidelines to ensure that EU
  investment does not damage or diminish the values of cultural heritage".



## Two overall principles

### Openness and transparency

 wide expert-led process, engaging experts and stakeholders (also in other sectors) in the debate, and even the wider public for some specific points.

### Accessibility and inclusivity

- Results accessible and understandable for non-specialists.
- European principles and values should be understood and endorsed.

# (7)Heritage at risk: fighting against illicit trade in cultural goods and managing risks in heritage sites



### Main components:

- Regulatory measures Regulation on imports of cultural goods
- Awareness raising and capacity building activities

### I - Completing the Legal Framework

Council Regulation (EC) No 116/2009 – provisions to ensure that **exports** of cultural goods are subject to uniform controls at the Union's external borders.

Directive 2014/60/EU on the **return** of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State.

Council Regulation (EC) No 1210/2003 of 7 July 2003 and Council Regulation (EU) No 36/2012 the EU introduced restrictive measures in respect of the trade in cultural goods from **Iraq and Syria.** 

Commission proposal for a Regulation on the import of cultural goods COM(2017) 375 final 13.07.2017

To **prevent the import and storage** in the EU of cultural goods illicitly exported from a third country)






### **Key lessons learnt**

The integration of cultural heritage into national disaster and risk reduction strategies developed by EU Member States suffers from:

- Lack of coordination between and across the different (European, National and Regional) strategies of risk management policies in most countries.
- Lack of alignment in the responsibility chain from policy making to practical application.
- Low current priority of cultural heritage in risk management planning.
- Lack of integration of cultural heritage protection measures into risk management strategies.

The Recommendations are framed in line with the Sendai Four Priorities





# **EU Research and Innovation** for 'Heritage at Risk'

### Policy framework and ongoing investment:

The EU supports research and innovation in cultural heritage in all pillars of H2020 framework programme.

In the 'Heritage Alive' policy initiative Cultural Heritage is seen as a strategic living resource to protect, conserve and transmit.

The EU has already invested over **47 M€** targeting **cultural heritage under threat** of: natural and man-made disasters, abandonment and mis-use, climate change effects etc.

The EU integrated approach has promoted the development of

- advanced monitoring methods decision support systems,
- risk assessment models,
- new approaches and methods to build resilience against climate change effects,
- new business models to regenerate abandoned heritage assets,
- resilience and sustainable reconstruction methods for historic areas
- Etc.

FOR THE FUTURE OF EUROPE

#### ACTION 1 DEVELOPING THE EUROPEAN ACTION PLAN FOR CULTURAL HERITAGE

We call for an ambitious European Action Plan for Cultural Heritage as a lasting legacy of the European Year of Cultural Heritage. This Action Plan which is already announced in the recently adopted New European Agenda for Culture, must be prepared and implemented with full involvement and engagement of all relevant public and private stakeholders, including civil society. It must also be holistic and interconnected with other key EU policy agendas and priorities, fully in line with the recent conclusions of the EU Council. We refer to objectives and policy areas such as social cohesion, regional development, urban development, rural development, environment, maritime and tourism policies, sustainability agenda and climate change adaptation, research and innovation, digital policy, education and skills and, of course, the youth. This Action Plan should furthermore also have a strong external dimension since the European Union must also take global responsibility and reach out to partners across and beyond the borders of the EU. The Action Plan should therefore be coherent with the Council of Europe's Faro Convention on the Value of Cultural Heritage for Society and its recent European Heritage Strategy for the 21st century, and with the UN Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development.

- Legacy of the European Year of Cultural Heritage
- Keeping the momentum engagement of stakeholders, Member States and EU institutions
- Continuity, without prejudice to the next MFF
- Mainstreaming Open, inclusive and integrated approach
- Governance
