Highlights

Presentation of a study: 'Impacts of the digital economy on the food-chain and the CAP'



The study presents an overview of digitalisation in agriculture, the impacts of new technologies on the agri-food value chains and opportunities for the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP). Using case studies and examples, the study demonstrates the need for further deployment of innovation in the agriculture sector, fostering research and investment in digital agriculture and integrating agri-tech into the policy agenda.

Public Hearing on "Evolution of the performance framework in the Common Agriculture Policy"



The Committee will hold a public hearing on the “Evolution of the Performance Framework in the Common Agricultural Policy”. This hearing will fall within the current AGRI legislative work on the CAP beyond 2020. A shift towards a more performance-oriented CAP is indeed an important component of the reform package proposed by the European Commission. The purpose of the hearing will be to assess and discuss the current Common Monitoring and Evaluation Framework, and to learn from it in the context of the related developments contained in the legislative proposal.
