5. Working document on pilot projects and preparatory actions in budget 2014 and 2015 Commission's first interim report on the implementation of PPPAs 2014

• Exchange of views

PP-PAs are important tools for the formulation of political priorities and the introduction of new initiatives that, if proved successful, may turn into standing EU activities and programmes. As every year, the 2015 annual budgetary procedure contains a mechanism for agreeing on a package of new and on-going pilot projects (PP) and preparatory actions (PA).

The procedure starts with an exchange of views on the Commission First Interim Report on the Implementation of PP-PAs in the 2014 budget and a Working Document which describes the procedure for 2015. Out of the 66 pilot projects and preparatory actions, the interim report sets out the main elements for the implementation of 60 projects/actions totalling EUR 72,16 million in commitment appropriations. For 4 projects/actions (representing a total amount of EUR 4,75 million in commitment appropriations), the Commission considers, in line with the position expressed in the letter of executability of 25 October 2013, that the proposed actions can be covered by an existing legal base; the Commission therefore proposes to transfer the appropriations to the relevant legal base's budget lines. For 1 preparatory action (representing an amount of EUR 1,5 million in commitment appropriations), the Commission considers that appropriations voted under the 2014 budget may not be implemented as on-going actions financed by previous years' appropriations already address the objectives set out for the action. Finally for one preparatory action, representing an amount of EUR 1 million in commitment appropriations, the Commission is at this stage still examining the possible options for the implementation of the action.

Given the time needed by the Commission ahead of the financing decision, a specific procedure, **including sending proposals for PP-PAs for pre-assessment** to the Commission, has been implemented with fruitful results since 2011. An early dialogue will be started with the Commission to improve and clarify the implementation of proposed new and on-going projects and actions.

Please note that this year, however, due to the European Parliament elections as an exception to the rule there will be two rounds of submission of pilot project and preparatory action proposals to the Commission for pre-assessment; 5 June for outgoing Members and 9 July for incoming Members. Please also note that if the proposals for pilot projects and preparatory actions are to become part of the budget and thereby finally authorized, they must also be tabled as budgetary amendments to the draft budget in September.

6. Draft Amending Budget No 1 to the general budget 2014 - Statement of revenue by section - Statement of expenditure by section - Section III - Commission

• Exchange of views

Ms Jensen will inform BUDG members of the amendments received to her draft report on DAB 1, as well as any other recent developments.

The only amendment received was from ITRE, whereby it proposes to include EUR 53 mio in the line 08 02 04 01 "Science for and with Society" in order to align it with the Horizon 2020 work-programmes for 2014-2015, adopted on 10 Dec 2013 (EC Decision C (2013)8631). It foresees around 53m€ for activities under "Science with and for Society" for 2014. ITRE want this to be an overall budgetary neutral operation (i.e. funds should be ensured from Horizon 2020 overall budget) but leaves it to BUDG to decide which lines then to cut. According to information from the Commission, the EUR 53 million will be transferred to the line 08 02 04 01 via an internal transfer, in order to ensure that there is no delay in the calls of proposals. The Commission informed the Rapporteur that it intends to do an additional transfer request to allocate this EUR 53 million but has not indicated when.

Another change that might be necessary in DAB 1 is related to the agreement between the Parliament and the Council on the EIF capital increase. Contrary to the Commission proposal, the Parliament and the Council agreed to not treat dividends as assigned revenue yet (subject to reconsider this option later), which will increase the amounts for the period 2014 - 2017 from EUR 170 to EUR 178 million. The Commission should explain to BUDG members whether it intends to submit an amending letter to compensate for this change. Since the treatment of dividends only concerned the remarks of budget article 850 Dividends paid by the European Investment Fund in the Commission draft, and the legal basis always takes precedent over the budgetary remarks, the Commission does not see a need to change its initial proposal in that respect. There was no amount mentioned for the assigned revenue from dividends in the Commission's draft.

The Council will examine the subject again at its meeting of 25 March and the objective is to have it adopted in

early April in order to enable the Parliament to also do its reading by the last plenary session of this legislative period.

The issue will be raised at the budgetary trilogue on 2 April and therefore the vote in BUDG is expected to take place on 10 April.

9. Presentation of the study "How do members states handle contributions to the EU budget in their national budgets"

Co-Rapporteurs: J. L. Dehaene- A.E. Jensen

This study examines the details of the timing and predictability of the EU receipts, the handling of the various stages of the procedures and the consequences in general for the EU and national public finances. It also offers a short assessment of the implication for the Own Resources of possible additional taxes and tariffs and a more fundamental reform of the determination of the financing of the EU budget and the handling of the contributions to the EU in Member States' budgets.

10. Monitoring group on the Fund for the European Aid to the Most Deprived and implementation of extra funds for 2014

The general rapporteurs for budgets N and N+1, Ms Jensen and Ms Gardiazábal, have organised a monitoring group to examine the implementation of the Fund for the European Aid to the Most Deprived and the extra funds allocated for 2014. The two rapporteurs are expecting answers from the Commission regarding the timeliness of the implementation, measures to ensure a smooth transition between the two MFFs, avoiding overlaps with national measures and others.

Consideration and adoption

On 16 January 2014, the Conference of Presidents authorised BUDG committee to draft an own-initiative report entitled "Negotiations on the MFF 2014-2020: lessons to be learned and the way forward".

The Rapporteurs presented their draft initiative report on 22 January and a second exchange of views took place on 4 March.

100 amendments were tabled to the report, including from the ITRE and FEMM Committees. AFCO, under Article 50, REGI, LIBE and EMPL delivered an opinion.

BUDG will vote on those amendments and on the 15 compromise amendments proposed by the Rapporteurs.
