Internal Market & Services DG

Reasons for the Recommendation

- Single market not functioning as well as it should
 - Single Market Review and the results of the public consultation
 - fact-finding carried out with Member States
- Even more urgent need for an efficient single market in the current economic context (priority initiative)



How to address shortcomings?

- Stronger ownership of the single market and closer partnerships between Member States and the Commission to make the single market work better
- Need for closer cooperation and shared responsibility underlined in 2009 Competitiveness Council conclusions

Approach while preparing the Recommendation

- Bottom-up approach and close cooperation between the Commission and Member States
- Pragmatic approach
 - measures draw closely on good practices that have proved to work well in some Member States
 - national authorities can choose practices that will work best in their national setting

- Concrete measures that Member States are invited to take to implement the recommendations
- List of practices of certain Member States, on which these measures are based

CONTENT OF THE RECOMMENDATION



Internal coordination on single market issues

 Issue: dispersed competences for single market issues among different national authorities

- assign function of coordination on SM issues
- ensure coordination within and between national, regional and local levels of government

Cross-border cooperation on single market issues

- Issue: need of more awareness and support for administrative cooperation
- Proposed measures:
 - support networks at national level (through training, raising awareness, sufficient resources)
 - organise exchanges of officials

Transposing single market Directives

- Issue: still need to improve timeliness and quality of transposition
- Proposed measures:
 - prepare well in advance for transposition and ensure cooperation between officials responsible
 - involve national parliaments and other stakeholders during negotiations and the transposition process

Market monitoring

• **Issue:** importance of market monitoring to understand which sectors do not function well for citizens and businesses

- actively contribute to EU level market monitoring
- consider carrying out such monitoring at national level

Applying single market rules

• **Issue:** in some cases still insufficient training and awareness about single market rules among civil servants

- provide life-long training to civil servants
 regarding single market rules
- provide practical guidance and advice regarding application of SM rules in practice

Enforcing single market rules

 Issue: need of further support for problemsolving mechanisms, and of more training for judges

- ensure that simple and inexpensive alternative dispute resolution procedures are available
- provide life-long training and easy access to information on single market rules to judges

Evaluating and assessing national legislation

- Issue: importance of regular evaluation of application and reviews of national legislation
- Proposed measures:
 - adopt a systematic approach to evaluate national legislation which implements single market rules
 - review the other existing national rules to ensure there are no obstacles to the single market

Providing information on single market issues

• **Issue**: still insufficient information about single market rights among citizens and businesses

- make practical information easily accessible and ensure good links between EU and national sources of information
- promote and raise awareness about EU information systems
