The EMPL Committee has a very busy agenda at the beginning of October.

The hearing of the Commissioner-designate for Jobs, Nicolas Schmit, took place on 1 October. The joint EMPL-FEMM hearing of Helena Dalli, Commissioner-

designate for Equality, will be held on 2 October. The joint EMPL-ECON hearing of the Executive Vice-President-designate for an Economy that Works for People, Valdis Dombrovskis, is scheduled for 8 October.

In addition, to the hearings, the EMPL Committee will hold regular committee meetings on 2 and 7 October. On 2 October, there will be a vote on the decision to enter into interinstitutional negotiations on Parliament's position adopted at first reading on the proposal for the European Social Fund Plus. There will also be votes on the draft reports on 'Amending the Regulation on the European Globalisation Adjustment Fund' and on the 'Employment and social policies of the euro area'. Finally, the European Court of Auditors' Special Report on the Fund for European Aid to the Most Deprived, published in April 2019, will be presented.

On 7 October, the EMPL Committee will hold a hearing with the candidates to be appointed by the European Parliament as independent experts to the Management Boards of four agencies.

#### **European Social Fund Plus (ESF+)**

Vote on the decision to enter into interinstitutional negotiations (see <u>meeting documents</u>)

On 2 October, the EMPL Committee will vote on the decision to enter into interinstitutional negotiations on Parliaments position adopted at first reading on the proposal on the European Social Fund Plus (ESF+). If the outcome of the vote is positive, trilogue negotiations can start.

## Amending the Regulation on the European Globalisation Adjustment Fund (EGF)

Vote on draft report (see meeting documents)

On 2 October, the draft report on the proposal for a Regulation amending Regulation (EU) No 1309/2013 on the European Globalisation Adjustment Fund (2014-2020) will be put to the vote. The aim of the proposal is to enable the EGF to support workers made redundant as a result of the likely economic disruptions caused by a withdrawal of the United Kingdom from the EU without a withdrawal agreement. In her draft report, the Rapporteur proposes to take over the Commission proposal without amendments.

### Employment and social policies of the euro area

Vote on draft report (see meeting documents)



The draft report on employment and social policies of the Euro area will be put to the vote on 2 October. The draft report states that while the economic conditions in the EU are currently favourable

and overall employment is steadily growing, there is still a need for improvement in terms of youth unemployment, labour market segmentation and inequalities, in-work poverty and productivity.

# Designation of experts to the Management Boards of Cedefop, Eurofound, EU-OSHA and ELA

The revised Founding Regulations of Cedefop, Eurofound and EU-OSHA, which entered into force on 20 February 2019, and the Founding Regulation of the recently created European Labour Authority (ELA), stipulate that the European Parliament can appoint one independent expert to the Management Boards of each of these Agencies. During the EMPL meeting on 7 October, EMPL Members will hold an exchange of views with shortlisted candidates and adopt a list of persons eligible to be appointed members of the respective Management Boards. The final decision on the appointment is taken by the Conference of Presidents.

Presentation of a study

On 2 October, representatives of the European Court of Auditors (ECA) will present the Special report "FEAD - Fund for European Aid to the most Deprived: valuable support but its contribution to reducing poverty is not yet established" to the EMPL Committee. The FEAD provides €3.8 billion of EU funding for the programme period 2014-2020 and is implemented at national level through operational programmes. It offers both material assistance and social inclusion measures, in addition to food aid.
