#### **PACE** resolution

27 June 2019

Resolution 2293 "Daphne Caruana Galizia's assassination and the rule of law in Malta and beyond: ensuring that the whole truth emerges"

Maltese government action 23 September 2019

Maltese government ordered a public inquiry into the murder of journalist Daphne Caruana Galizia, following up on a June 2019 PACE resolution demanding the setting up of an independent public inquiry into her death within three months.

#### **PACE** declaration

4 October 2019

Daphne Caruana Galizia inquiry in Malta 'does not meet the Assembly's expectations'

## Freedom of Expression Report

#### **MAJOR CHALLENGES**

- Two assassinations of journalists in Europe investigating corruption and organised crime
- ➤ Restrictive legislation that undermines their freedom of speech and association
- Adverse impacts of the digital revolution on the financial viability of quality journalism
- Shutdowns of media outlets and criminal prosecutions of journalists
- ➤ Growing responsibilities of major online platforms for containing the spread of disinformation and terrorist propaganda, protecting user privacy and other interests
