3. Investigations conducted by the European Anti-Fraud Office (OLAF) as regards cooperation with the European Public Prosecutor's Office and the effectiveness of OLAF investigations

#### **Adoption of draft report**

On 23 May 2018, the Commission adopted the proposal (COM(2018)338 final) for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Regulation (EU, Euratom) No 883/2013 concerning investigations conducted by the European Anti-Fraud Office (OLAF) as regards cooperation with the European Public Prosecutor's Office

and the effectiveness of OLAF investigations.

At an early stage the Rapporteur consulted the coordinators of the political groups on the question whether to limit the revision of the regulation to the amendments proposed by the Commission, or to pursue a more comprehensive approach. Given the weaknesses in the functioning of OLAF, coordinators favoured a more comprehensive approach.

On 12 July 2018, Ms Gräßle presented her working document summarising the questions at stake. The presentation was followed up by a workshop on the subject on 11 October 2018. The OLAF Supervisory Committee sent its observations with regard to the Commission proposal to CONT on 21 November 2018. The European Court of Auditors commented on the Commission proposal in its Opinion 8/2018 published on 22 November 2018. The Court's opinion was presented in CONT committee on 13 December 2018.

Members tabled 87 additional amendments to the draft report. Furthermore, JURI drafted 49 and LIBE 58 amendments. The Rapporteur met with the shadows on 27 February to discuss possible compromises. An additional meeting at technical level took place on 5 March 2019. Subsequently, the rapporteur's voting list was made available. ## 4. ECA Special Report 3/2019 (Discharge 2018): European Fund for Strategic Investments: Action needed to make EFSI a full success

The European Fund for Strategic Investments (EFSI) was set up in 2015 as part of the "Investment Plan for Europe" designed to tackle the investment gap that emerged following the financial and economic crisis, which began in 2008, with the goal of

mobilising an additional €315 billion, by July 2018, of strategic investments in infrastructure and SMEs, covering most EU policy areas and all Member States.

The Court assessed whether EFSI was effective in raising finance to support additional investment within the whole EU, the audit covering the EFSI operations from its launch in 2015 until July 2018. According to the ECA's assessment of the EFSI's performance, EFSI has been effective in raising finance to support additional strategic investments in the EU. However, the reported estimate of investment mobilised does not take account of the fact that some EFSI operations replaced other EIB operations and EU financial instruments and the fact that a part of the EFSI support went to projects that could have been financed from other sources of public or private finance.

The Court further considered that the methodology used to estimate the investment mobilised overstated, in some cases, the extent to which EFSI support actually induced additional investment in the real economy. The lack of comparable performance and monitoring indicators for all EU financial instruments and budgetary guarantees diminishes transparency and the ability to assess results.

In addition, the Court stated that action needs to be taken to improve the geographic spread of EFSI supported investment. The EFSI portfolio at the end of 2017 was within the indicative limits set for investing in specific policy sectors. However, the geographic concentration of EFSI signed financing operations was not sufficiently balanced, mostly ending up in a few of the larger EU 15 Member States. The countries with the highest EFSI uptake were those with the most developed and active National Promotional Banks and Institutions.

The Committee on Budgetary Control will hold an exchange of views with DG REGIO on the discrepancy between DG REGIO public procurement data and the data contained in the study on the EU-funded large-scale infrastructure and the public procurement procedures presented at the CONT meeting on 26 November 2018.

The study showed that the TED database suffers from deficiencies. Much of the data is missing and the data that is present in the database include significant errors.

Following the study findings CONT Members asked for the briefing on the gaps and errors in the TED database to be commissioned and presented at the exchange of views. The briefing will look at the deficiencies of the current TED database and it will propose recommendations on how to make the TED database a useful and reliable tool for analysis.
