

# Main differences between the EU and US systems (1/2)



#### EU

- ✓ WTO TBT Code of good practice signed by CEN, CENELEC and all of their members separately
- ✓ 3 Standardization Bodies responsible for specific sectors
- ✓ 1 product = 1 standard
- ✓ 1 standard = identical in 33 countries
- ✓ Tendency to use SDoC+ market surveillance

### US

- ✓ WTO TBT Code of good practice signed by ANSI "on behalf of" US SDOs
- √ >600 SDOs with overlapping sectors of activity
- ✓ 1 product = X standards
- ✓ ≠ standards at State level→ fragmented market
- ✓ Tendency to use pre-market 3<sup>rd</sup>-party certification

# Main differences between the EU and US systems (2/2)



### EU

- Clear link with EU legislation, enabling stakeholder information & participation before standards publication
- ✓ ISO & IEC: the international standards bodies

✓ 31% CEN catalogue = ISO 75% CENELEC catalogue = IEC

## US

- ✓ Any executive authority (federal/sub-federal) can prescribe any <u>published</u> standard
- Many US SDOs considered as international standards bodies at the same level as ISO & IEC
- ✓ No statistics on uptake of ISO/IEC standards (very low)



# CEN, CENELEC, ETSI and ANSI moving towards a formal cooperation



# Objectives identified:

- ✓ To enhance mutual understanding
- ✓ To facilitate trade between US and Europe
- ✓ To enable the development and delivery of consistent messages about standardization

Common objective: MoU to be signed in 2014



# Potential sectors and activities concerned by a cooperation



**Sectors** identified by CEN, CENELEC, their members and partners:

- ✓ Automotive
- ✓ Bio-based products
- ✓ PPE
- ✓ Textile & textile products
- Medical devices
- Playground equipment & amusement park machinery

**Activities** which may result from a MoU:

- Exchange of information to avoid future divergence in EU/US specifications
- Technical cooperation to enable experts to align requirements
- ✓ Joint events
- **√** ...

Provide a framework fulfilling the expectations of European industry, SMEs, consumers and other stakeholders

#### **Coherency**

Increase coherency of US catalogues of standards

### **Transparency (on draft standards)**

Advanced info about standards likely to support US legislation & opportunity to contribute

### **Transparency (on published standards)**

Increase transparency on (outdated) references to standards in US legislation

## Reciprocity

- √ "Fair play" with regards to conformity assessment in US legislation
- ✓ Avoid references to conformity assessment in US Standards
- ✓ Real market access in the US (federal & sub-federal levels)
