Demographic change

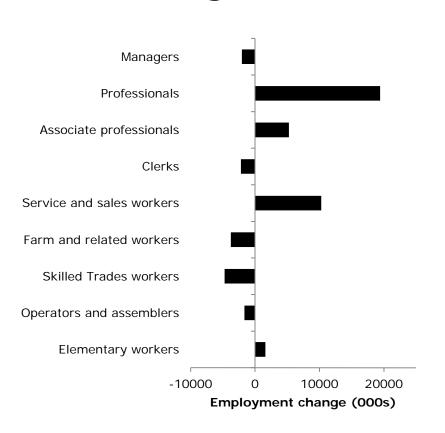
## **Implications**

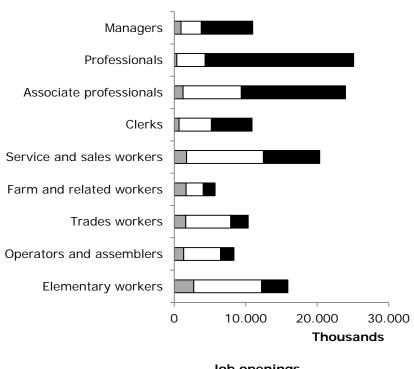
Increased demand for people with high skills
Some evidence of polarisation
Skills matching becoming more difficult
Skills obsolescence is a problem, especially for low skilled people

# **VET and upskilling**

#### **VET**

- Effective means of training – especially workplace based elements
- Closely tied to the labour market
- Relatively good returns to VET graduates
- Attractiveness remains an issue

## **Upskilling**

- Skill levels have increased, but...
- ... basic skills proficiency a problem for many
- Longevity and the need for upskilling / reskilling

# Challenges: no easy solution to persistent challenges

#### **VET**

- Making VET a first choice
- Blurring the boundaries between VET and general education
- Blurring boundaries between IVET and CVET / adult learning
- Skills matching making supply responsive to demand
- Which skills to invest in?

## Upskilling

- Creating an environment of lifelong learning
- Finding the means to reach groups which by definition are hard to reach
- Upskilling before skills obsolescence or job loss

# **EU** policy

- VET and upskilling
- European Pillar on Social Rights / New Skills Agenda
- VET
- Work-based learning / high quality apprenticeships / Quality assurance / Strengthening key competences / Skills anticipation / Awareness raising / Cedefop and ETF
- Upskilling
- Agenda for Adult Learning / EPALE / Upskilling Pathways (New Skills Agenda)

## The Way Forward

Persistent / longstanding issues (lots of policy initiatives for learning lessons)

- VET needs to be broad based / with input from social partners / IVET can serve adults / needs to be available at all levels
- Upskilling empowering individuals / use of individual learning accounts, training leave and social partnership to promote access

Continued need to monitor emerging skill demand – use of cutting-edge methods (big data) – and its impact on employment

Past still a good guide to the future
