


AMR is global issue

- 700,000 global deaths annually as a result of some antibiotics no longer working
- Projected increase to**10 million** by 2050
- Economic damage on par with 2008 financial crisis

- Developing a global research agenda




New AMR Action Plan/ EU- a best practice region on AMR


New AMR Action Plan/ Research, development and innovation
