


# **Dublin III**



## **Key stats**



- About 1 in 3 asylum-seekers arriving to Europe is a child (UNICEF)
- Between 2015 and 2019 about 225,000 asylum-seeking unaccompanied children arrived to the EU (Eurostat)
- 30,000 migrant children reported missing between 2014-2017 (EMN)

# Why do children go missing?




- identification of children upon arrival
- Insufficient legal information and support
- Lack of guardian/representative
- Inadequate family reunification procedures/ lack of relocation schemes
- Inadequate reception and insufficient access to rights (education, training, health, etc.)

### Measures in Dublin III to protect children

- Art.4.3 (right to information) specific leaflet for minors
- Art.6: guarantees for minors
  - Best interests
  - Representative
  - Asylum application where they are present (MA judgment)
  - Staff trained on needs of minors
- Art.8: specific criteria for minors
  - Family
  - Best interests
  - Where they are legally present
  - → Overall: strong focus on protection and keeping families together

#### Recommendations



- Protection systems <u>within</u> the EU need to be strengthened (AMIF accountability)
- Train border guards on child protection/child safeguarding (EBCG)
- Child-friendly information and building trust
- Immediate access to guardian/representative (Dublin/RCD/APR)
- Remove obstacles to family reunification (+relocation)
