The Establishment of an EU Mechanism on Democracy, the Rule of Law and Fundamental Rights

The rapporteur for opinion on this file Mr Cimoszewicz, will present his draft opinion to the own initiative legislative report prepared by LIBE committee. This draft opinion highlights the substantial deterioration in the EU with regard to the observance of fundamental values, in particular the rule of law, which is one of the core values of the EU as a community based on law.

According to the draft opinion, with regard to the nature of the mechanism, the establishment of the annual monitoring cycle on the Rule of Law, Democracy and Fundamental Rights, should be based on principle of mutual sincere cooperation, where each of the institutions contributes to the defence of those core EU values. Such cooperation should take a form of an interinstitutional agreement, which would also allow to establish a joint body for coordination of the annual cycle.

As for the governing principles, the draft opinion sets out that the process should be transparent, impartial, maintain equality between Member States, be objective-based and lead to realistic measures. On the enforcement side, it also calls for the cycle to inform the Commission's decisions about whether to launch systemic infringement procedure and highlights the need for an urgency mechanism to deal with cases of grave violation of the EU values. This would include enhancing the role of the ECJ in defence of EU law, requiring the Commission to request systematically interim relief measures.
